Bittner, second base; Matt Medura, Mike Janosik, outfielders; Brian Move, third base; Darren Ford, first base; Mark Farrell, shortstop or second base; and Mike Hoffman.

The Mountaineers lost two of their star pitchers, Jim Lord and Steve Thomas, as well as Steve Federici and Jerry Rollman.

"We should have a powerful hitting group again this year and a strong infield," said Wolensky. "We have Dave Thomas, our infield anchor, Art Coolbaugh and A. J. Bittner. Darren Breining is one of the better catchers in the area and he is a leader.

"Tim Grove was one of the top three hitters in the league last year and will be strong again this season. We are one of the stronger hitting teams in the league, but we have a young pitching staff. If some of these produce we can make the playoffs.

Wolensky said he has a good bunch of boys and he is optimistic about the season. There are four playoff spots in the league and the come out for the team.

Mountaineers will be battling for one of these.

Dallas opens its season April 6 with Coughlin, one of the strongest teams in the league, a game Wolensky believes will give him a good indication of what the team will do. He doesn't foresee a runaway on the part of any team since he believes most of them are well matched.
