

Want to shed pounds? Try these tips Here's an exercise checklist to follow

If you'd like to shed the extra pounds you've gained over the winter months, try these weight reduction tips from the American Heart Association, Northeastern Pa. Region.

There is no quick and easy way to lose weight, but these suggestions will make dieting easier. Together with a balanced diet, they'll help you to form good life-long eating habits and maintain proper weight.

- Keep a record of what and when you eat.
- Record the calories as you eat the foods.

- When shopping, make a list and stick to it.
- Eating before you shop helps stop impulse buying.
- Don't buy high calories snack foods.
- Set up a regular 3 meal eating schedule.
- Eat in only one place in the house. Don't do anything while you eat.
- Prepare smaller portions and put them in smaller bowls and dishes.
- Make seconds hard to get — keep extra food off the table.

To help you choose and make low calorie foods, the American Heart Association has put together the pamphlet "A Guide for Weight Reduction." This pamphlet gives you tips on weight reduction and outlines nutritious eating patterns at three different calorie levels.

For information on your calorie level, the Heart Association urges you to talk to your doctor.

With warm weather approaching, many people will begin exercise programs to get rid of the excess winter weight. The American Heart Association has put a checklist together for those who are going to start an exercise program.

- Check with your doctor. He or she will help find a program which suits your needs and physical condition.

Pick activities which are rhythmic, repetitive and which challenge the circulatory system, at an intensity that is appropriate for you. These activities include walking, hiking,

jogging, bicycling, swimming, roller skating, jumping rope, and active sports or games.

- Pick activities which you enjoy, which are suited to your needs and which can be done year round. Your exercise program should be fun and rewarding for you, so you'll want to continue. It should demand no exhaust. You will be more satisfied if you stick to your program faithfully.
- Wear appropriate clothing. Even the most enthusiastic exercise is likely to be discouraged by aching feet and sore muscles. Consider the

temperature and humidity — avoid extremes.

- Remember to warm-up and cool-down. You should warm-up at least 3-5 minutes. Warm-up will increase breathing, circulation and body temperature. It also helps stretch muscles, tendons and connective tissue. Cooling-down is just as important. Don't just stand around or lie down immediately. Walk around a few minutes. This will let your body readjust gradually to a decrease in physical demand.
- Follow the program regularly.

a. Pursuant to Section 707(1) of the Public School Code of 1949, as amended, the Secretary of the Dallas School District shall cause to be published a request for sealed bids for the purchase of the aforesaid premises and improvements erected thereon if any, upon the terms and conditions set forth below, in the WILKES-BARRE TIMES LEADER, CITIZENS' VOICE, THE DALLAS POST AND THE LUZERNE LEGAL REGISTER, once a week for three (3) successive weeks and by posting at least two (2) handbills on the premises to be sold and posting at conspicuous places within the vicinity of said real estate at least five (5) handbills, commencing in the week of March 12th, 1984.

b. The terms and conditions of the sale of the aforesaid realty are as follows:

a. All bids for purchase shall be securely sealed and delivered to the Secretary of Dallas School District, Administration Building, Church Street, Dallas, Pennsylvania 18612 on or before 4:00 o'clock P.M. (E.S.T.) on April 9th, 1984.

b. The premises shall be sold as a whole and not divided or otherwise separated in any manner whatsoever. The premises shall be sold free and clear of all liens and encumbrances and subject to any exceptions, reservations, conditions, covenants, prior conveyances, and proceedings by eminent domain as may appear in the line of title. Conveyance of title shall be by Quitclaim Deed.

c. All bids shall represent the net consideration for such sale. All real estate transfer taxes, assessments and other like charges shall be borne exclusively by the successful bidder, and there shall be no apportionment of the same at the time of settlement.

d. The Board of Directors of Dallas School District reserves the unqualified right and privilege, in its sole discretion, to accept or reject any bid submitted for the purchase of said realty, without cause stated.

AMENDMENTS TO DALLAS TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 1965-2

The proposed ordinance will amend the Township Zoning Ordinance adopted in 1965 as follows:

SECTION 2.02 will be clarified by the addition of a sentence in relation to Planning Building Groups (Page 2); and

ARTICLE 4 will be amended by deleting multiple dwellings as permitted uses in various districts and by adding Planned Residential Groups and Shopping Centers to various districts (Pages 11 to 14); and

ARTICLE V will be amended by deleting the minimum lot dimension per dwelling unit in R-2 and R-3 districts (Page 24); and

ARTICLE 6.151 will be amended to eliminate the minimum size requirement for neighborhood and community shopping centers (Page 38); and

ARTICLE 6.152 will be amended by deleting the lowest permissive minimum lot area in districts R-2 and R-3; and by setting the requirement for minimum area for the entire development (pages 45 to 48); and

ARTICLE 9.05 will be amended by revising the Schedule of Fees for Zoning Permits and other applications (Pages 70 and 71); and

The definition of Multiple Dwelling in Article 11.025 will be clarified with a requirement that an application for multiple dwellings be made under Article 6.152 (page 77); and

The definition of Shopping Center in Article 11.052 will be clarified with a requirement that an application for any Shopping Center be made under Article 6.151 (Page 81).

Copies to the proposed ordinance may be examined at the Dallas Township Municipal Building at any time.
