## Eating habits and food can affect tooth decay

Eating patterns and food choices can be important factors in how much tooth decay you have. The reason is simple: everything you eat passes through your mouth.

When foods are eaten that contain carbohydrates (sugars and starches), the bacteria in plaque produce acids that can destroy tooth enamel. The sticky plaque holds

these acids onto the teeth. This acid continues to attack for 20 minutes or more. After many such attacks, the tooth enamel may break down, forming a cavity.

School officials must review a child's immunization record. Parents are asked to bring all necessary immunization records at the time of registration. No child will be admitted in the Lake-Lehman School District until proof of immunization is presented to the school

Before entering school, State Law requires the following immuniza-

Vaccination for small pox is no longer required for admission to school. However, the Department of Health has asked that an accurate record be kept of all vaccinations. If your child has been vaccinated, please present the vaccination certificate at the time of registration.

It should also be remembered that once a child is enrolled in the public school, he then falls within the provisions of the Compulsory Attendance Law.

Parents are reminded to have the child's birth certificate at the time
