LL Board announces new admission policy

The following policy on admission of beginners has been adopted by the Lake-Lehman School Board:

Kindergarten — Children who have reached the age of 5 years of Sept. 30, 1984 will be admitted to first grade.

First Grade — Children who have reached the age of 6 years by Sept. 30, 1984, will be admitted to first grade.

All-Day Kindergarten — Kindergarten in the Lake-Lehman School District is an all-day program.

Registration and screening for kindergarten and first grade students will be held in the area according to the following alphabetical schedule of the child's last name:

In order to be sure of how many children will be attending kindergarten and first grade next year, the school district asks that parents make an effort to register their children between April 9 and 13.

Any parent who is unable to register their child during this time

may also register in the Elementary Office located in the Lehman-Jackson Elementary Building in Lehman or at the Lake-Noxen Elementary Building in Harveys Lake. Both offices are open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.

The School Board reminds parents that the Administration and Board of Directors reserve the right to assign children to different buildings. In order to maintain reasonable sized classrooms, it may be necessary to transfer children to another building within the district. If this is the case, transportation will be provided.

This year a Pre-Kindergarten Survey Clinic will be conducted at the same time as registration. The evaluation will consist of the following screening areas:

1. Hearing
2. Speech
3. Vision
4. Motor Perception and Coordination
5. Kindergarten Readiness Assessment

School officials must review a child's immunization record. Parents are asked to bring all necessary immunization records at the time of registration. No child will be admitted in the Lake-Lehman School District until proof of immunization is presented to the school nurses.

Before entering school, State Law requires the following immunizations:

Vaccination for small pox is no longer required for admission to school. However, the Department of Health has asked that an accurate record be kept of all vaccinations. If your child has been vaccinated, please present the vaccination certificate at the time of registration.

It should also be remembered that once a child is enrolled in the public school, he then falls within the provisions of the Compulsory Attendance Law.

Parents are reminded to have the child's birth certificate at the time of registration.

Commonwealth files revised phone tariffs

Commonwealth Telephone Company recently filed revised tariffs to become effective April 5, 1984.

These tariffs will increase the state tax surcharge on customers' bills from 5.0 percent to 6.9 percent. The tariffs were filed in accordance with the State Tax Adjustment Procedure Order of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission.

Each year, all operating telephone companies in Pennsylvania

are required to recompute their surcharges. This year the result for Commonwealth is an increase of 1.9 percent. The new rate will apply to intrastate services billed after April 5, 1984. Subject to the tax are those services which originate and terminate within Pennsylvania.

Commonwealth Telephone Company serves the diversified communications needs of 140,000 customers in a 19-county area of Eastern Pennsylvania.

Veterinary Hospital receives certification

Dr. Richard C. Post is the owner of the hospital.

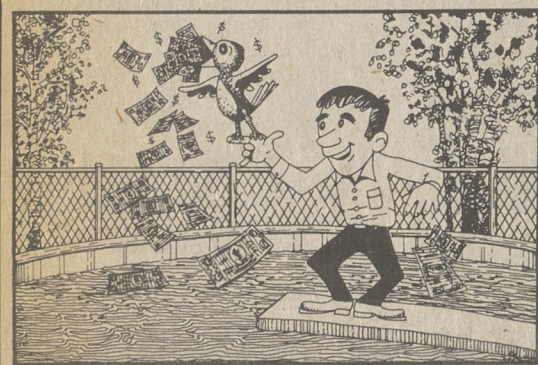
Eating habits and food can affect tooth decay

Eating patterns and food choices can be important factors in how much tooth decay you have. The reason is simple: everything you eat passes through your mouth.

When foods are eaten that contain carbohydrates (sugars and starches), the bacteria in plaque produce acids that can destroy tooth enamel. The sticky plaque holds

these acids onto the teeth. This acid continues to attack for 20 minutes or more. After many such attacks, the tooth enamel may break down, forming a cavity.

The amount of carbohydrates in a food is only one of the factors that determines its effects on the teeth said the Pennsylvania Dental Association.
