

# Sports Road running season begins at PSU/W-B

## **TACKLE TIPS**

Pennsylvania is the only place in the world where you can find all six species of the pike family. Five of these (American muskellunge, northern pike, chain pickerel, grass pickerel, and redfin pickerel) are native to the Keystone State. The sixth member of the family – the Siberian muskellunge (Amur pike) - was imported by the PENnsylvania Fish Commission from Russian in 1968 and an experimental planting made in Glendale Lake, PRInce Gallitzin State PARk, Cambria County.
