Mr. Franklin told of his many inventions which are part of our daily lives, bifocal glasses, the Franklin Stove, the public library, the fire company and the lightning rod.

Mr. Franklin's talk was sponsored by the Dallas Intermediate School Parent-Teachers Organization.

Committee to evaluate Lake-Lehman

Lake-Lehman Junior-Senior High School will be evaluated by a visiting committee appointed by the Commission on Secondary Schools of the Middle States Association on Oct. 24, 25 and 26 of this year. The Commission on Secondary Schools was established to promote the improvement of secondary education.

During this school year each member of the high school staff is serving on committees for the purpose of self-evaluation. Each committee will review its own evaluation and determine strengths and make recommendations for improvement. These major findings will be reviewed before the entire faculty for approval and will then be presented to the visiting committee.

During the three days in October, the visiting team will study the committee reports, observe classes, talk with teachers, students and administrators, tour the school community and become familiar with the general operation of the school system.

At the conclusion of the evaluation, a written report of the committee's evaluation is sent to Lake-Lehman. This report will serve as a guide to the staff and administration in the ever-progressing process of education.
