

Lehman's volleyball streak comes to end

The Lake-Lehman boys' volleyball team saw its 25-match winning streak come to an end last Tuesday when it went down to defeat at the hands of Wyoming Valley West in the PIAA District 2 championship game. The Spartans won the match, 15-13, 11-15, and 15-10, and will now compete in the PIAA tournament scheduled for April 27 and 28 at Shippensburg State

Valley West took an early 3-0 lead in the first

game, but the Black Knights bounced back to tie the score. With the score then knotted at 9-all, Valley West served five straight points and a violation against Lehman on a free ball gave the Spartans their first-game victory.

In the second game, Lake-Lehman's Mike Stash, who finished the game with six points, had five of those points early in the match, putting the Back Mountain boys on top, 8-4.

Valley West then fought back to a 9-8 lead but Greg Javer and Dave Jachimowicz combined to put Lehman over the top.

Lehman enjoyed a 6-4 lead early in the third match, but the Spartans rallied to come back, 8-4. Javer and Chris Kukosky worked together to bring the Knights back to tie the score but two Valley West spikes gave the Spartans the edge in the final match.


Jill Solinski and Beth Finn shared the pitching duties with Solinski grabbing the win.
