The win put the Lady Knight record at 8-0 leaving them in sole possession of the lead.

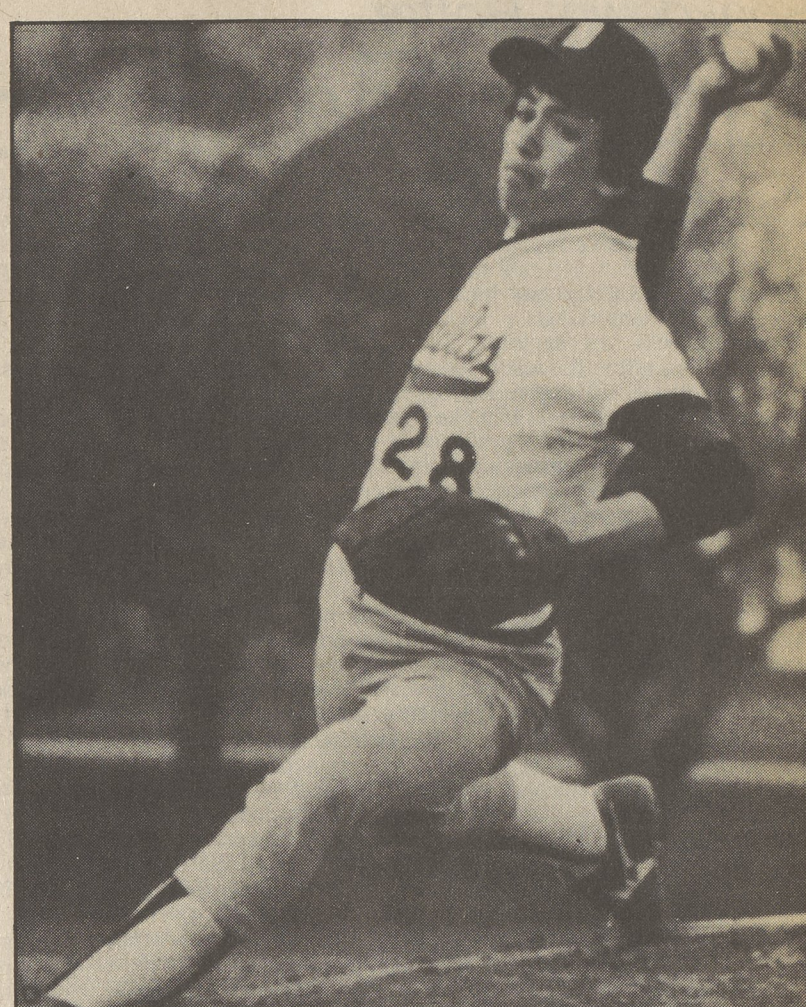
On Monday afternoon, Solinski used 11 strikeouts to cool off the hot G.A.R. team and shut them out 12-0.

J. Lutz was the losing pitcher for the Titans.

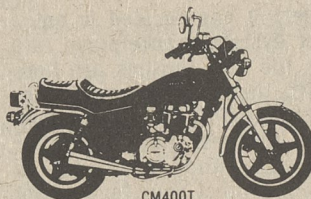
