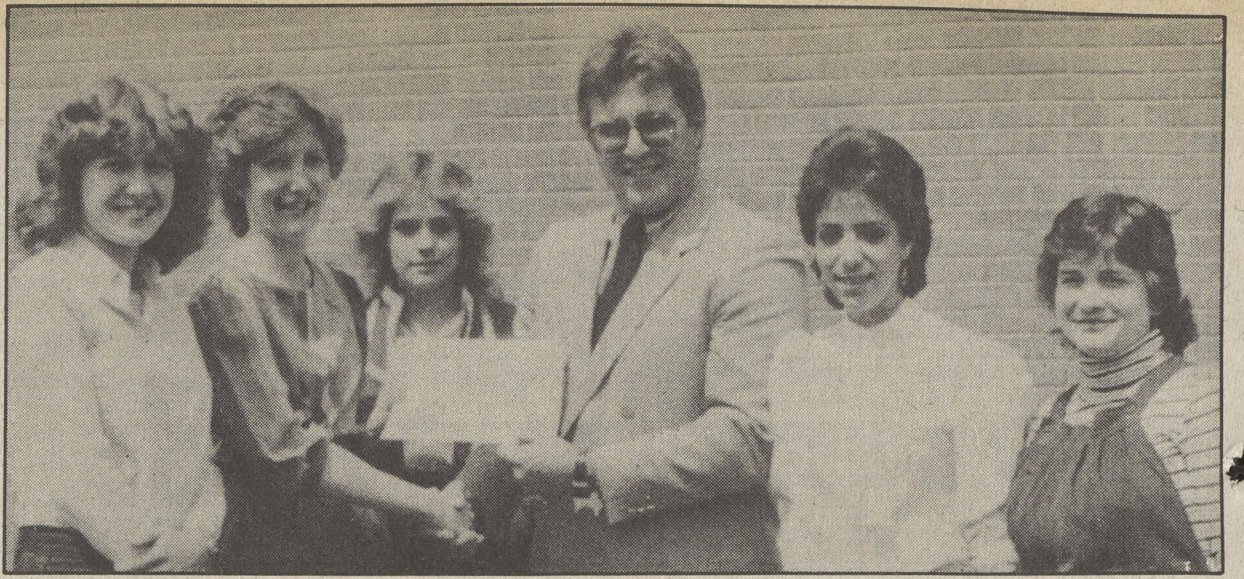




Seniors honored

AAA honors O'Connell, Graham

Jim O'Connell and Jill Graham, Dallas High School seniors, were two of nine students from four schools in the Valley Automobile Club (AAA) area selected as award winners in the American Automobile Association's 40th Annual School Traffic Safety Poster competition. The local club had 462 entries

submitted by elementary and secondary school artists in the club area.

Winners were selected by a panel of judges from among 54,751 entries representing 2,948 schools from 40 states, District of Columbia and Canada.

In the AAA safety poster competition, students design posters around one of 20 safety themes. Winners are selected from each of the following grade levels: K-3; 4-6; 7-9; and 10-12. Posters are judged on originality, art execution, visual impact of the basic safety concept and interpretation of the safety slogan.

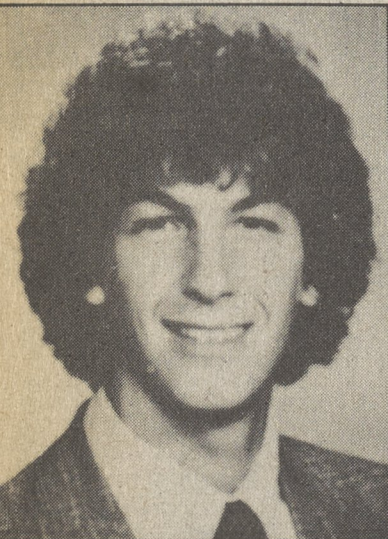
