Swetland Homestead open to public through Labor Day

on Wyoming Avenue near the Midway Shopping Center in the borough of Wyoming, is now open to the public until Labor Day. Hours of visitation will be Thursday, friday, Saturday and Sunday from 12 noon with 14 p.m.

until 4 p.m. The Homestead is one of the two oldest homes in the Wyoming Valley. It was begun in 1797 by Revolutionary War veteran, Luke Swetland and remained in the Swetland Family until 1958 when Luke's great-great-granddaughter, Mrs. Frank G. Darte, gave the house to the Wyoming Historical and Geological Society. Each of the five downstairs rooms in the Homestead is furnished in a different period style. As visitors move from the 18th century settler's cabin to the Victorian parlor, they are shown changes in lifestyles and taste for a 60-yar

period. The first portion of the home, a cabin built by Luke Swetland, contained two downstairs rooms and a large loft above. Today, the cabin's original fireplace with its bake oven and furnishings reminiscent of the

The Swetland Homestead, located n Wyoming Avenue near the visitors an introduction to the history of the home.

Moving through the house guests view the dining room with its Federal period, furniture illustrating the tastes and syles of the early 19th century. From the dining room one enters the front hall with its Empir furnishings depicting the accepted styles of the 1820's. The final two downstairs rooms include a bedroom and a parlor with appointments from the Victorian era of the 1860's.

The Wyoming Historical and Geological Society has maintained this historic building as a community educational resource for over 20 years. In addition to summer visitation hours, the Homestead is open to area elementary schools for class tours in the spring and fall.

Admission to the home is \$1.00 for adults, \$.50 for children 5-16, and no charge for children under 5. The Wyoming Historical and Geo-

logical Society is a non-profit community organization dedicated to preserving and interpreting the history of Luzerne County.
