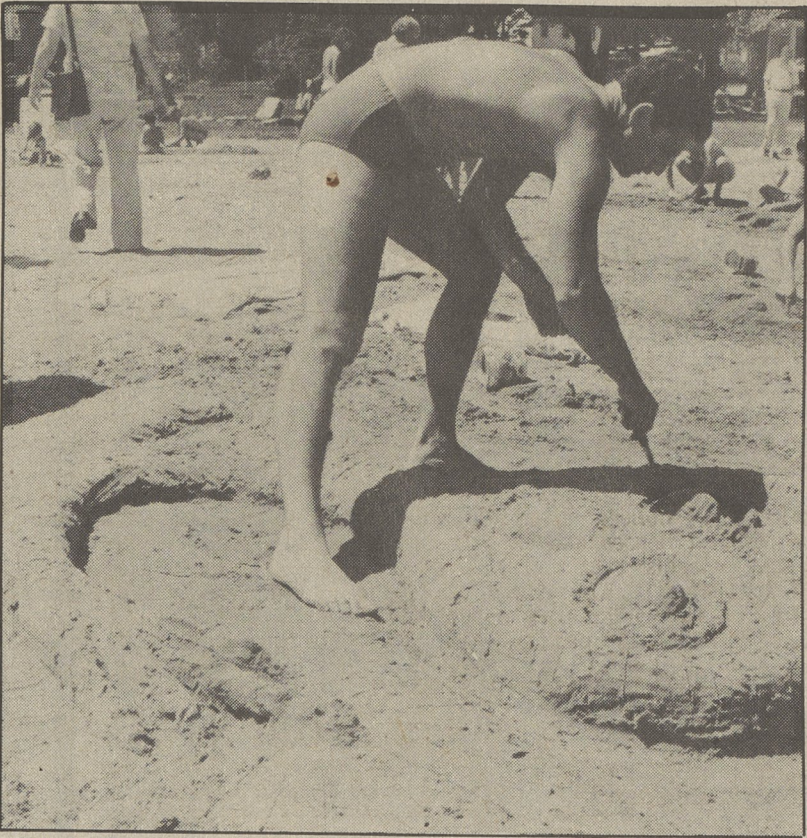

Homecoming Festival was action-packed



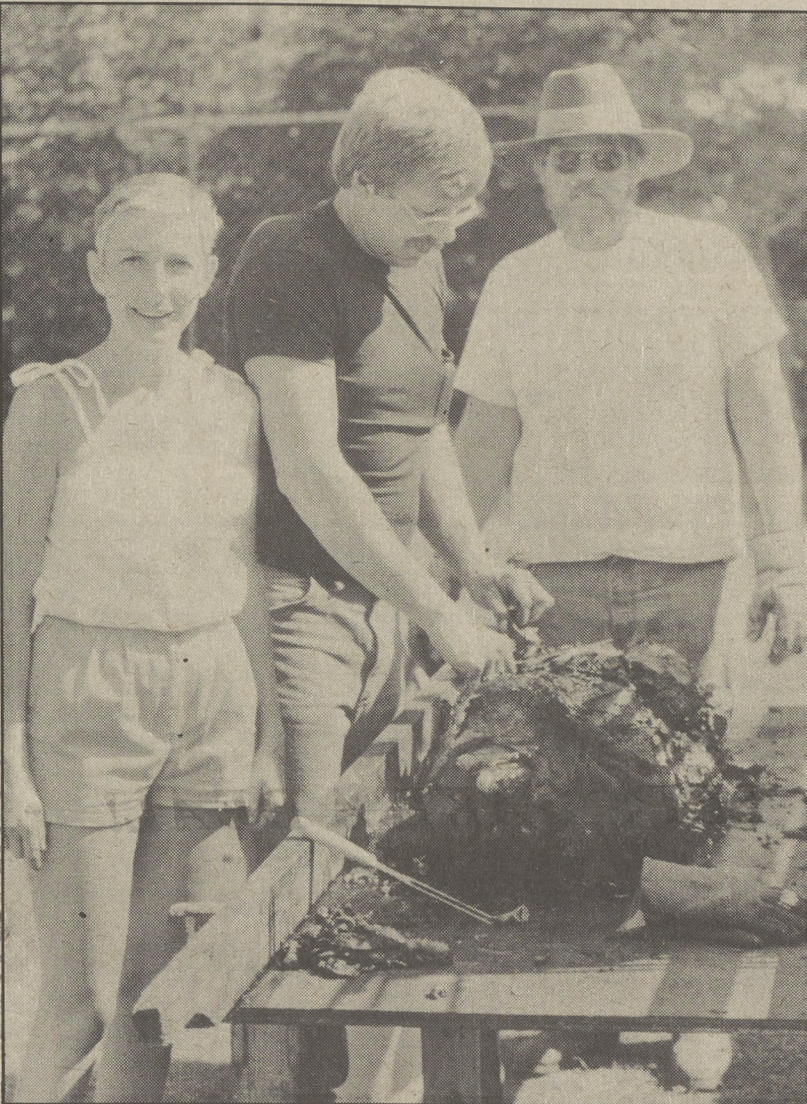
Rich Reggie of Harveys Lake makes sculpture

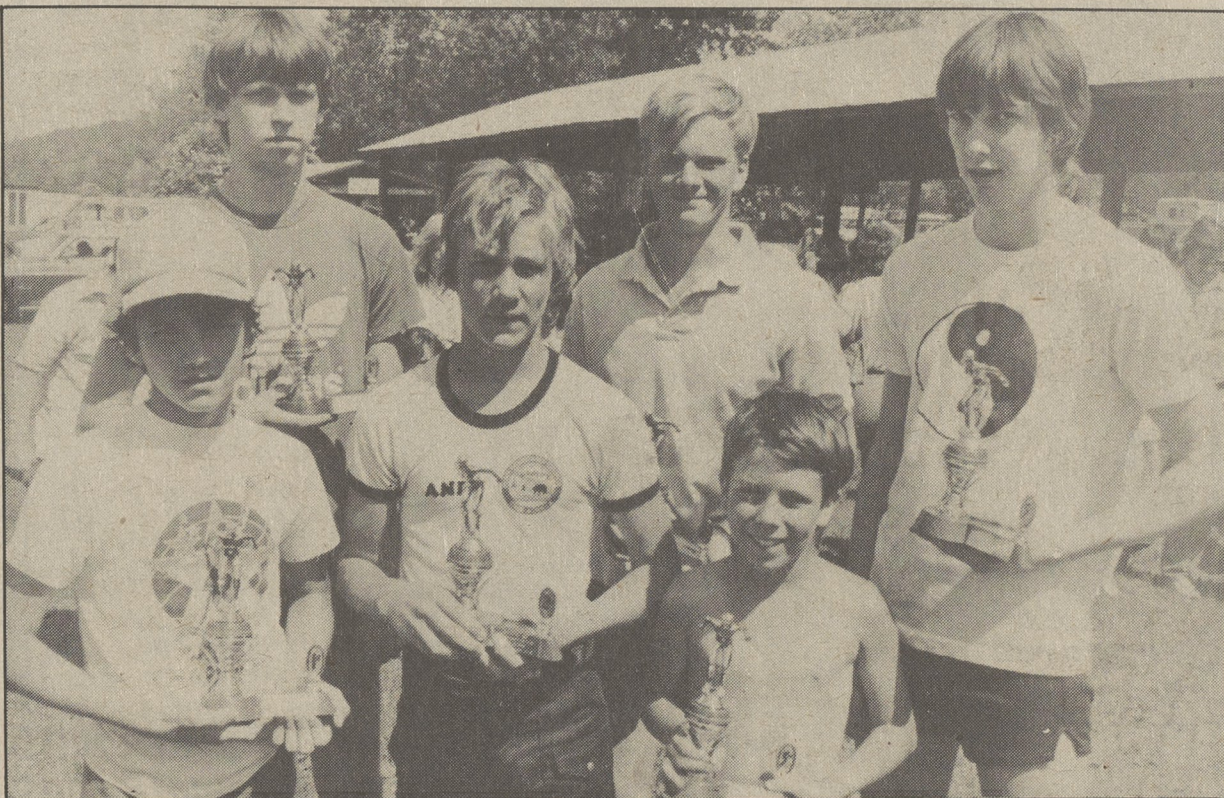
