The appointment of Ray E. Burd, Jr., as director of public relations at King's College recently was announced by Rev. James Lackemier, C.S.C., president of the College.

Burd's appointment was effective June 29. In his new post, he will assume responsibilities in the areas of publicity, advertising and marketing King's College and its programs. The Public Relations Office will serve to coordinate the efforts of the Admissions Office, Center for Part-Time Studies, and the academic and social programs at King's. Burd will also supervise the College's News Bureau Service, which will remain under the direction of nine-year King's veteran Jessie Robertine-Hardy.

Prior to joining the administration at King's, Burd had served for eight years as assistant director of public relations and publications at Shippensburg University, was a public information specialist in the Air Force (where he attained the rank of staff sergeant), and was a

reporter and assistant editor with the Centre Democrat, a weekly newspaper in Bellefonte.

He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in journalism and public relations from Empire State College of the State University of New York, attended Penn State University, where he studied journalism, and holds a Master of Science degree in mass communication from Shippensburg University.
