The Track II will program include the offering of Principles of Accounting I and II, Architectural Drafting, Basic Programming, Beginning Typewriting, Shorthand Theory, Business Communications, Word Processing, General Chemistry, Basic Photography, Basic News Writing, Food Santiation, Plumbing and Heating, Real Estate Practice, and Introduction to Philosphy.




