In addition, all participating runners are eligible to win a weekend excursion to New York City, including two nights lodging, two tickets to a Broadway show, plus, \$100 spending money. The drawing will be held during the award festivities in Courthouse Square following the Dairy Dash and a two-mile fun run. Awards will be presented to the top three finishers in the fun run open division competition.

The pre-registration deadline for both races is September 7. The preregistration fee for runners desiring a specially designed t-shirt is \$5 and \$3 for other entrants. 
