Child abuse looked at in new book

The tragedy of child abuse - its causes, consequences and some approaches for its prevention - is examined in a comprehensive booklet just published by the National Center for Child Abuse and Neglect, a unit of the U.S. Department of HHS' Office of Human Development Services.

The booklet, "Perspectives on Child Maltreatment in the Mid '80s," contains essays, accounts of research results, reports of case studies, and analysis and recommendations for program action. The material was contributed by more than 20 nationally-recognized experts in the field of child abuse prevention and treatment.

In an introduction to the 72-page booklet, HHS Secretary Margaret M. Heckler calls it "perhaps the most important booklet you will ever read" and labels the annually reported one million cases of child abuse "a startling statistic."

But she says the statistics "must do more than startle. They must stir all of us to action. The prevention - not correction but prevention - of child abuse has become critical."

Assistant Secretary for Human Development Dorcas R. Hardy, in a foreword to the booklet says: "Child abuse is not a new phenomenon nor is it endemic to one society or another. It is a problem that demands that each and every one of us think more about the value of our children."

In addition to a list of resources, the booklet includes a section on the responsibility of individuals to report cases of abuse and neglect-including a discussion of when and how to report incidents-as well as a state-by-state listing of where such reports should be made.

Camp Louise has last campfire

The last campfire for this season has been put out at Camp Louise on the Jonestown Mountain near Berwick. The Counselors have gone back to college. The resident campers have picked up most of the "lost" items from last and found. And Barbara "Raisin" Rosene, Camp Director for the Penn's Woods Girl Scout Council can look back on a summer of adventure and learning for all the girls who came to camp.

Ten girls and four staff members spent a week at camp preparing for a five day canoe trip on the Delaware River. This was the culmination of training they began last year in the "Creek Paddlers" program. They practiced canoe skills, did

their planning, and then had a real adventure, using all they had learned.

"Trail Blazers" was a new program this year. Seven girls took part. One week was spent at camp hiking to get in condition, learning to pack a back pack, organizing food, and planning the trip. They then spent five days hiking the Loyalsock Trail from Ringdale to World's End State Park. They enjoyed spectacular scenery and had adventures outwitting the friendly raccoons each night.

Four hearing impaired girls from Middleburg, Berwick, Selingsgrove and Nanticoke were able to enjoy camp. A counselor proficient in sign language could interpret when

needed. The girls all used sign language or read lips and could be mainstreamed into regular units.

Ten youngsters with special needs were able to enjoy themselves in the camp situation with staff specialists who were experienced in dealing with the mentally handicapped. Some of these girls were mainstreamed with other units. Activities for these girls were basically the same as for all other campers, just scaled to their abilities. The ratio of counselors to camper was higher to help the girls have a meaningful experience and develop their potential. The special unit enjoyed a dance and cookout with other units in camp at the same time.
