Pre-school program set

The Lake-Lehman School District announces a new Pre-School-Early Education Program for parents and their pre-school children (4-year-olds), featuring four to six annual presentations on a variety of topics in each elementary school. These presentations will be structured to offer concurrent activities for both parents and their children, and will deal with such topics as: physical wellness, nutrition, prevention of toxic substance exposure, full-time kindergarten orientation and screening, reading and math readiness, parent effectiveness training, etc.

Dr. M. David Preston, Superintendent of Schools, stated that this unique program is a result of team planning, involving participation of principals, teachers, counselors, and parents. The District's PTA's and PTO have endorsed this program, and will be involved in the presentations.

The first presentation, which will be an orientation to the District's

full-time kindergarten program, is scheduled for the Lehman-Jackson Elementary School on Thursday, Oct. 25, 9 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.; Lake-Noxen Elementary School on Thursday, Oct. 25, 9 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and Ross Elementary School on Friday, Oct. 26, 9 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. Separate activities are scheduled for both adults and children. Coffee and donuts will be available for parents. While parents are involved with presentations from principals, teachers, guidance counselor, and nurse, the children will be engaged in an organized playtime in the gym, storytime in the library, a building tour, and a snack.
