
ON TUESDAY, OCT. 30, 44 seniors from the Dallas center departed for Brown's Resort in the Catskills. A good time was had by

Following a two week wedding trip to Acapulco, Puerto Valarta and Cancun, Mexico, the Ackoureys are residing in Scranton.


