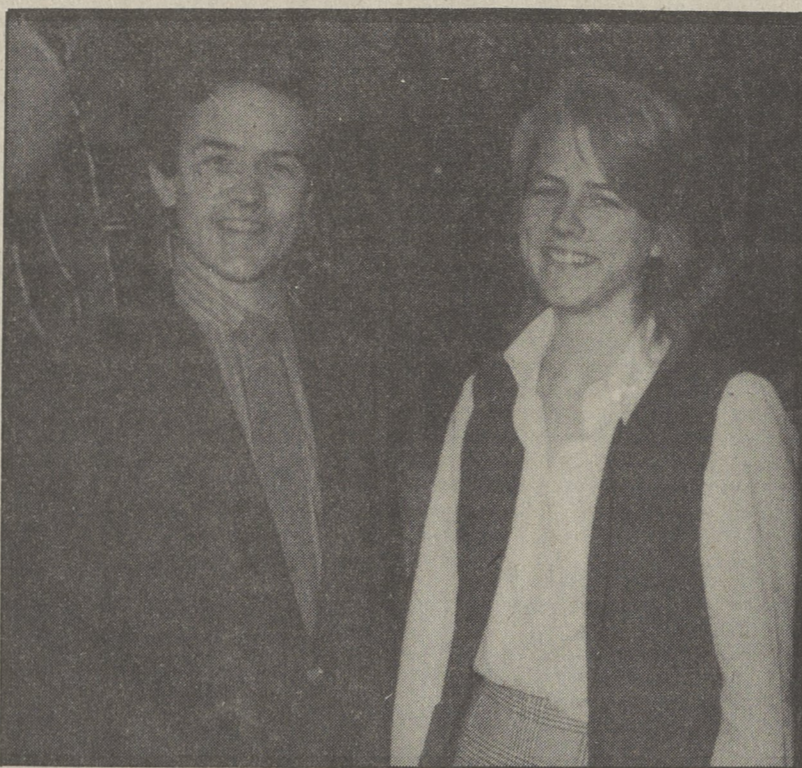
## Irem Ceremonial is Saturday
