THE STUDENT COUNCIL wants to thank the

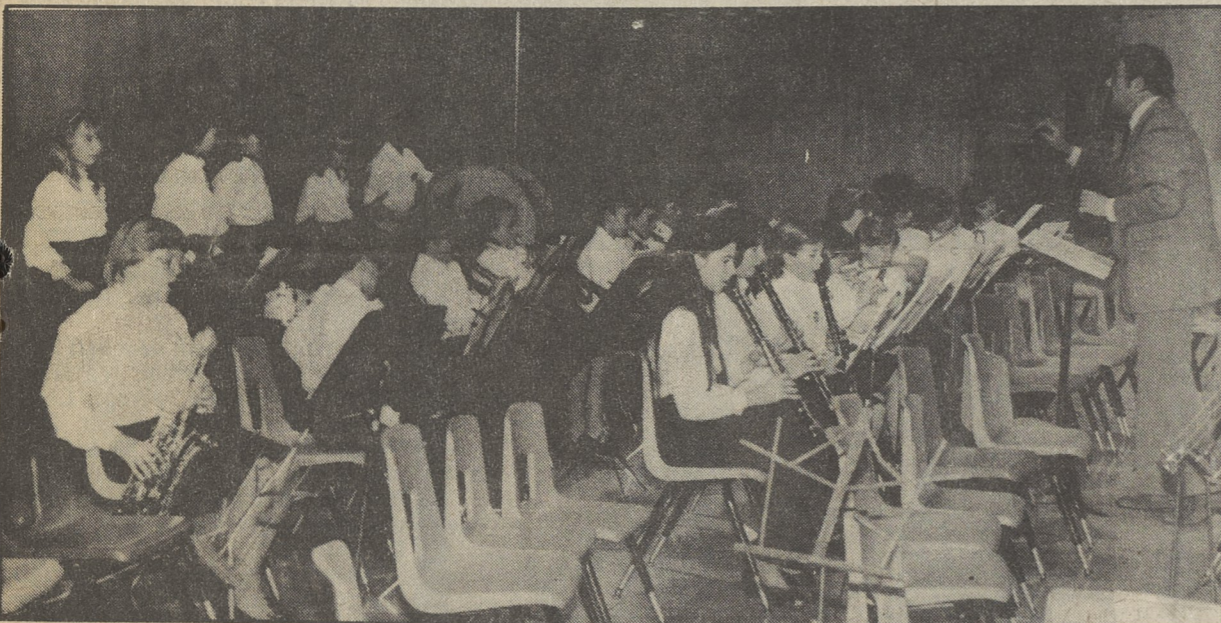
student body for their participation in the Heart to Heart program. Results should be in soon after Christmas vacation.
