Students at Trinity Nursery School entertain their families with delightful holiday songs and dances at the school's annual Christmas party.

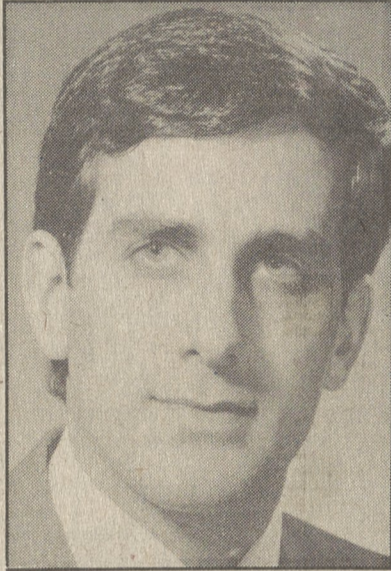

Russell Stone honored

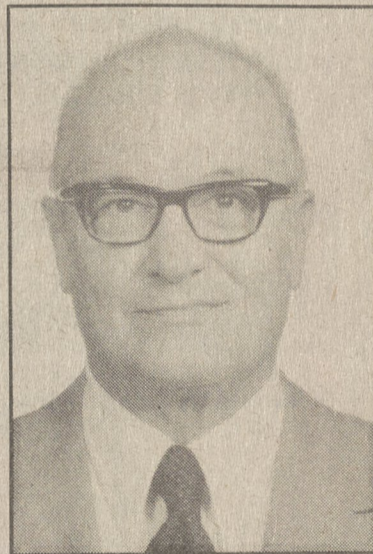
