Drop to 1-1 **Black Knights defeated** by Grenadiers, 61-34

Coach Rodger Bearde's Black Knights cagers from Lake-Lehman dropped to 1-1 in their division, Saturday, Dec. 22, when they were downed 61-34 by the GAR Grenadiers.

GAR took an early 10-6 lead at the end of the first period and held it throughout the contest despite the Knights giving them a good battle in the first half, the Knights rallied to come within two points of the Grenadiers

In the closing seconds GAR pulled in front by six and took a 24-18 lead into the lockerroom at halftime.

Grenadier Bill Callahan set the pace in the third period putting in eight points and leading in outscoring the Knights 16-4 in the quarter. In the final quarter, GAR outscored Lake-Lehman 21-12.

Callahan had a game total of 21 points, 10 baskets from the court and one-for-one from the foul line. Lionel Crawford hit double figures with 12, all of them from the playing court, and Greg Skrepenak put in 11, five through the nets from the court and one-for-three from the charity stripe.

T. Willy Cadwalader set the pace for the Black Knights with 12 points and Bill Bearde tossed in 10. Cadwalader made six shots from the court and Bearde put in five from the court.

The Knights went four-for-eight from the free stripe while the Grenadiers went three-for-eight. DALLAS WINS

In the Dallas Mountaineers game played with Seton Catholic on the Eagles court, Dec. 22, four Mountai-neers hit the double figures to aid in Dallas' 71-45 win over Seton. The win sent Dallas to 2-0.

Steve Wilson led the scoring with 16 points, puting six shots in from the playingfield and four-for-eight from the foul line. Mark Farrell collected 14 points, six two-pointers from the floor and two-for-two from the free stripe. Tim Cotter scored 13 points, all of them in the second half and Tim Moyer totaled 12.

Dallas outscored the Eagles 19-7 in the first period but the Eagles kept even with the Mountaineers in the second period for a 14-14 quarter giving Dallas a 33-21 lead at the half. The Mountaineers came on strong in the third period to outscore Seton 24-10 but in the final period, Seton again kept up with Dallas, both teams hitting 14 points, the gameending 71-45.
