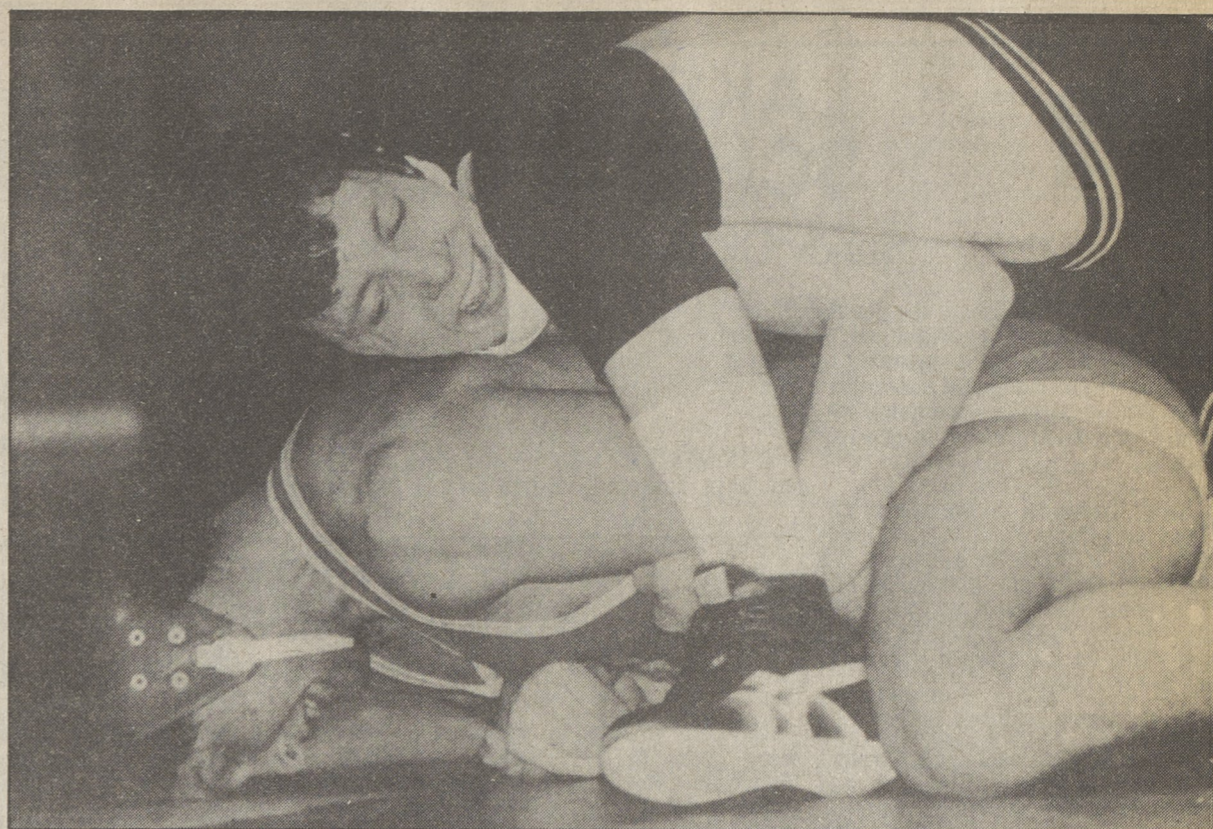
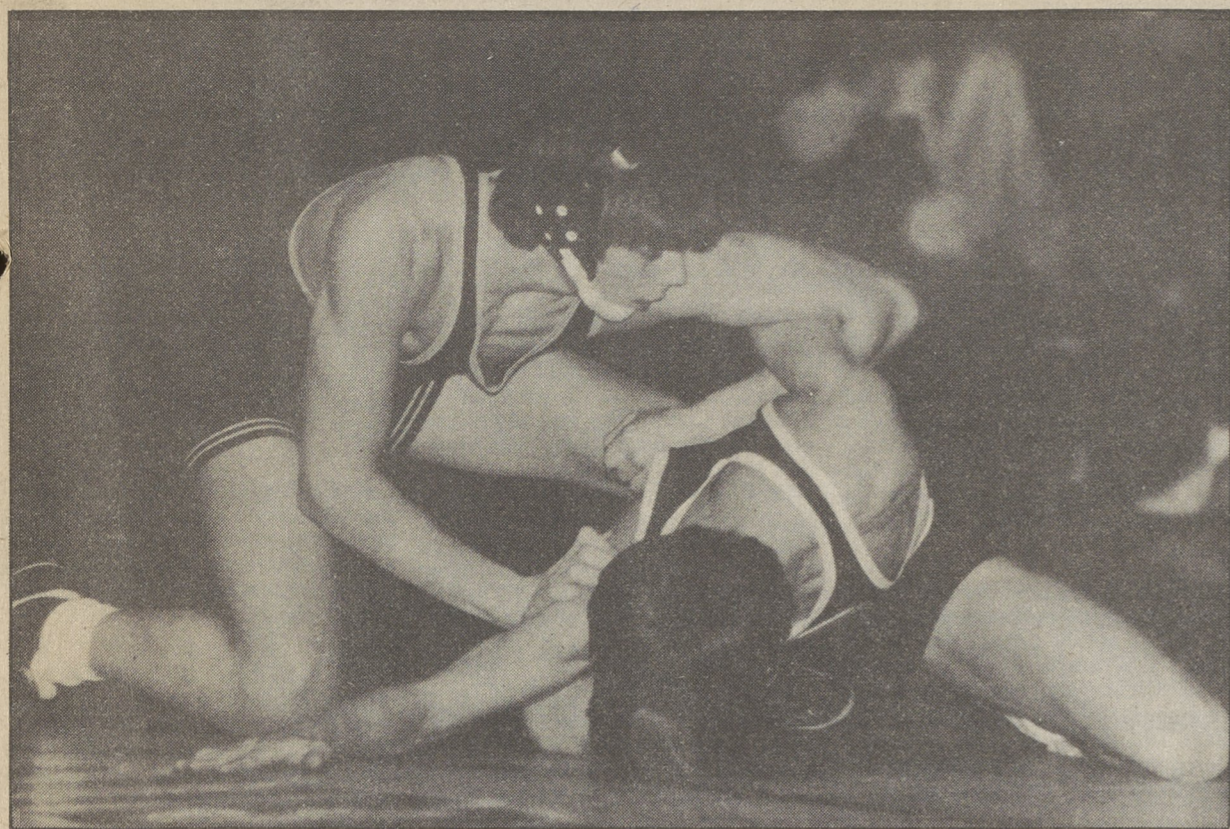

## LL wrestlers roll over unbeaten Meyers

The Lake-Lehman wrestling team defeated previously unbeaten Meyers 25-19 Wednesday. Dave Guzinski started the Black Knights rolling with a pin over Charlie Leo of Meyers at 112 lb. Other winners for Lehman were Don Spencer who decisioned Bob Thomas 8-5 a great 6-5 decision by Ed Statford over Willie Norton and a 5-0 decision by Norm Clancy over Dave Kratz.

This set up the final and decisive match of the evening between two of the area's fine heavyweights Charles VanGorder and Daryl Boich. Chris came away with a hard-earned 8-5 decision to give the Knights the final margin of

victory, and put them back in the hunt for the conference crown.

### DEFEAT DALLAS

Inspired by their victory over Meyers the Knights mauled their Back Mountain counterpart 39-8. Sweeping nine of the 12 bouts, rivalry could not help the Mountaineers stay close. For the Black and Gold pins were turned in by Jeff Austin at 105 lb. in 1:01 and Mark Yapple at 138 lb. in 2:40.

The Mountaineers lone victors were Bill Mathers at 119 lb. a (10-5) decision over Duane Miller. Mark Whitesell 155 lb. turned in a (7-1) decision over Don Spencer and a (7-2) victory by Charles Vincelli over 167 lb. Bill George.

### MOUNTAINEERS FALL

The young Dallas squad "took it to the limit" against Crestwood, but came up on the short end of a 36-27 score.

Led by a (9-1) Brian Mathers decision at 98 lbs. over Al Hosage and a (13-1) decision at 119 lb. by Bill Mathers, the brother team had the Mountaineers even after the first four meets.

Crestwood then came back to win the next three matches to take the lead.

Dallas rebounded to take three of the next four bouts behind the Patts brothers and Chris Vincelli. Joe Patts clamped his opponent Rich Knight at 145 lb. in 3:11. Chris followed with a pin at 167 lb. in 2:45 over Eric Costello and Jim Patts followed the trend with a '48 second pin at 185 lb. over Charlie Sobleski.

In the final match of the evening, however, Don Fry of Crestwood sealed the victory by going 5:12 before he pinned his Dallas counterpart to end the match.

## Bonomo brothers are named to East Team

Bloomsburg University's brother combination of Rick and Rocky Bonomo have been selected as members of the East team for the East-West All Star Wrestling Match scheduled for Monday, Feb. 4, at Utah State University, Logan, Utah. The annual event, which features the nation's top wrestlers in a dual match format, is set for 7 p.m. Mountain Time (9 p.m. EDT) in Utah State's 10,200 seat Spectrum.

The duo's selection makes Bloomsburg the only eastern university to have more than one performer selected to the squad. Iowa, currently ranked as the country's top team, led all teams with five all-star choices while Oklahoma State and the Huskies each had two selections.

In the 118-lb. bout, Rick—who is ranked number three in the weight class—will face top ranked Mark Perry of Oklahoma State. The Huskies' sophomore enters this weekend's Pennsylvania Conference Championships with a record of 22-2. His performance includes five falls, eight technical falls and nine decisions.

Rocky will face Barry Davis of Iowa in the 126 lb. match. Davis is ranked first and was a silver medalist at the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles, while Bonomo is rated third and has a perfect 25-0 record to date. He has pinned three opponents and scored nine technical falls and 13 decisions.
