## Knights lose to Hanover

# Title hopes squashed

The Hanover Hawkeyes placed a wrench in the gears of Lake-Lehman's quest for the Wyoming Valley Wrestling Conference championship, with a 29-28 upset over the Black Knights. The loss put Lehman at 10-2 for the year behind Tunkhannock (12-1) and Meyers (11-1).

The Hawkeyes took the first match with a 4-0 decision by Bob Hawkins over Reinert at 98 lbs.

Lehman came back with a 10-1 decision by Jeff Austin at 105 lbs. and a 13-2 decision by Guzinski at 112 lbs.

The Hawks Gary Kocher recorded a fall over Miller at 119 lbs. in 4:27.

The Knights roared back with three straight wins two by pins. Smith decisioned Morio 9-0 at 126 lbs., Guzinski pinned Williams at 132 lbs. in 2:49, followed by another fall at 138 lbs. when Norm Clancy dropped Warmen in 40 seconds.

Hanover then made it tough on the Knights, winning four of the next five matches, posting a 29-28 final

victory.

Poltz of Hanover started the trend for the Hawks at 145 lbs. with a 5-3 decision over Spencer. Goldowski came right back with a 19-0 thrashing over Yaple. Tom Bleich threw what proved to be a big blow at the Knights when he pinned George in 3:51 at 167 lbs.

Ed Stratford gave Lehman a chance for victory when he decisioned McNeil 12-2 at 185 lbs.

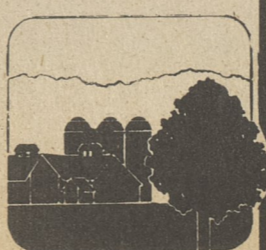
