A committee was appointed to seek a new director and accompanist for the group. For more information, please call Marianne Williams or Carolyn Straka.

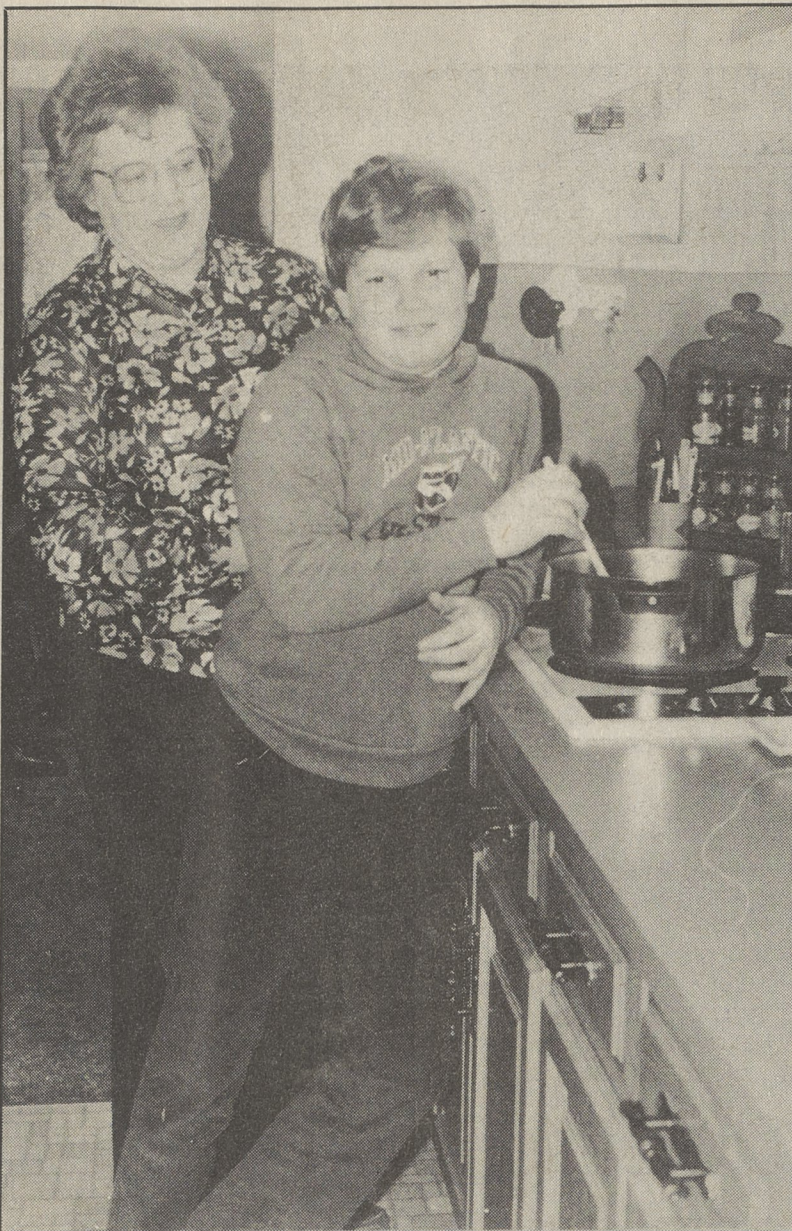
## Lions Club has meeting

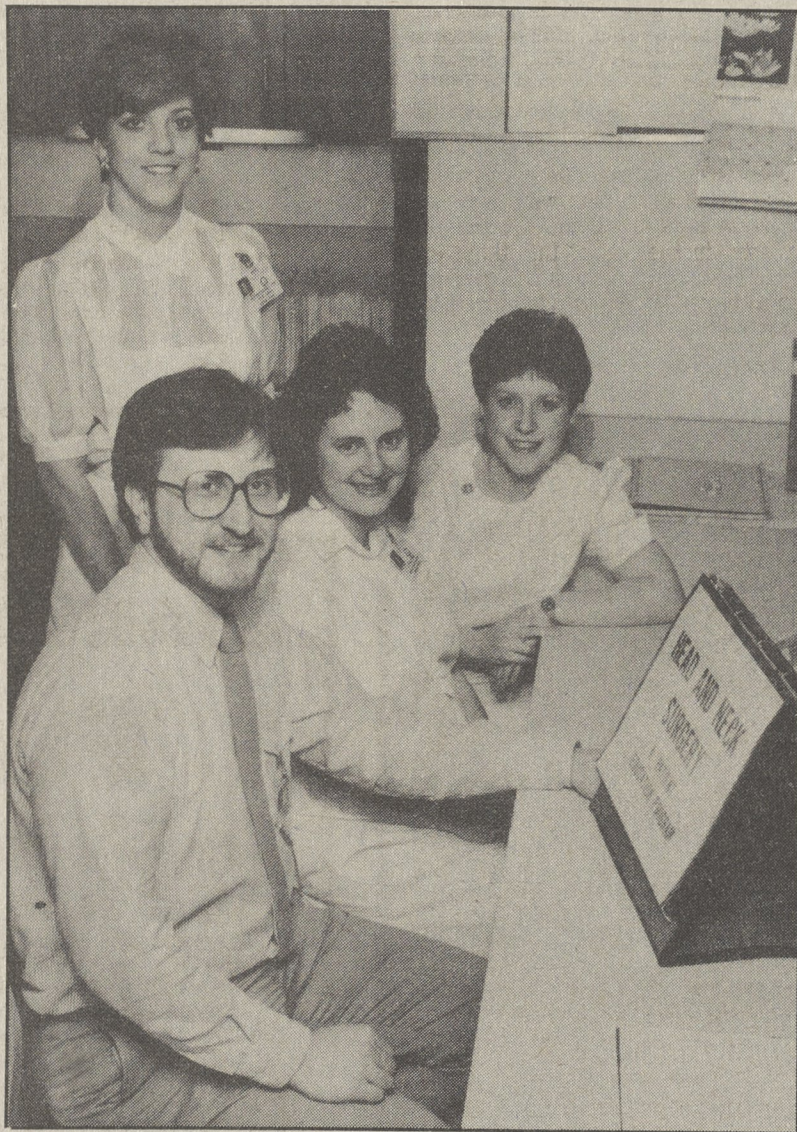

## Learning how

Wilkes-Barre General Hospital recently enhanced its patient teaching on head and neck surgery by developing a "flip-chart" for use by the nurses and patients. The "flip-chart" is a patient teaching aid that helps educate patients who will undergo a total laryngectomy (removal of vocal cords). It prepares pre-operative laryngectomy patients for all phases of surgery, including the post-operative recovery period and discharge.
