Dallas sets registration

Gerald J. Wycallis, Superintendent of the Dallas School District, announces Kindergarten Registration for the 1985-86 school year will be held in the Dallas Administrative Office Building, Church Street, Dallas on March 18, 19, 20 and 21. Hours will be from 9 a.m. to 12 noon and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Thursday. A birth certificate or other acceptable evidence of age must accompany each registration. A child must be five years of age on or before September 30, 1985 to make him or her eligible for Kindergarten.

Those with last names beginning with A,B,C,D, E, and F will register on Monday, March 18; those with G,H,I,J,K and L on Tuesday, March 19; those with M,N,O,P, and Q, on Wednesday, March 20; and those with R,S,T,U,V,X,Y and Z on Thursday, March 21. The children who will enter first grade but did not attend the Kindergarten program this past term, may also register on Thursday, March 21.

In addition to the registration, vision, speech and hearing screenings will be given.

Under the regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Health, all children, Kindergarten through 12th grade attending school after Aug. 1, 1983, will be required to provide proof of having received the following immunizations:

Three doses DTP (Diphtheria-Tetanus-Peritussis), TD or DT vaccine; for protection against Tetanus

(lockjaw) and Diphtheria. Three doses of Oral Polio Vaccine, or if prescribed by a physician, four doses of Salk Injectable Polio Vaccine. Students 18 years of age or older are exempt. The following vaccines administered at 12 months of age or older:

One dose of live attenuated Measles Vaccine or a blood test showing immunity. One dose of Live Rubella (German Measles) Vaccine or a blood test showing immunity. One dose of Live Mumps Vaccine or a signed statement from you physician stating that your child had the disease.

The school officials need to review the child's immunizations to be certain the child meets the standards as set by the state regarding immunizations. Parents are to bring all records of their child's immunizations. If the student's records do so not meet the standards, he or she will not be able to attend school.

If immunization is against your religious beliefs or you have a strong moral or ethical conviction similar to a religious belief, you must sign the reverse side of the "Certificate of Immunization" stating your reason. If immunization is not medically advisable at this time, a physician (M.D. or D.O.) must sign the medical exemption on the reverse side of the certificate. Please request the necessary form from the school nurse.

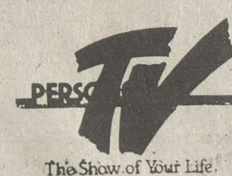
