Program discusses forestry

Youth Forestry Camp is a four day program which introduces you to the basic principles of forest management. Participants are introduced to the basic principles of forest ecology and its application in land management situations. Through classroom and field exercises, students develop an awareness of the challenges faced by resource managers.

Topics covered during the program include: tree identification, forest measurements, Multiple use of forests for timber, wildlife, and recreation; land use planning; career in natural resources.

There will be three camp sessions at the following locations: July 16-19, McKeever Environmental Learning Center, Mercer County. July 23-26, Stone Valley Civil Engineering Camp, Huntingdon County. August 13-16, Natural Science Solar Center, Pike County.

Young people ages 14-17 are eligible to attend. In order to participate in the program, you must be selected to receive a scholarship. These sponsors provide \$80 of the registration fee and you provide \$10. The fee covers meals, lodging, insurance, and program materials while at camp. You must provide your own transportation to and from camp.
