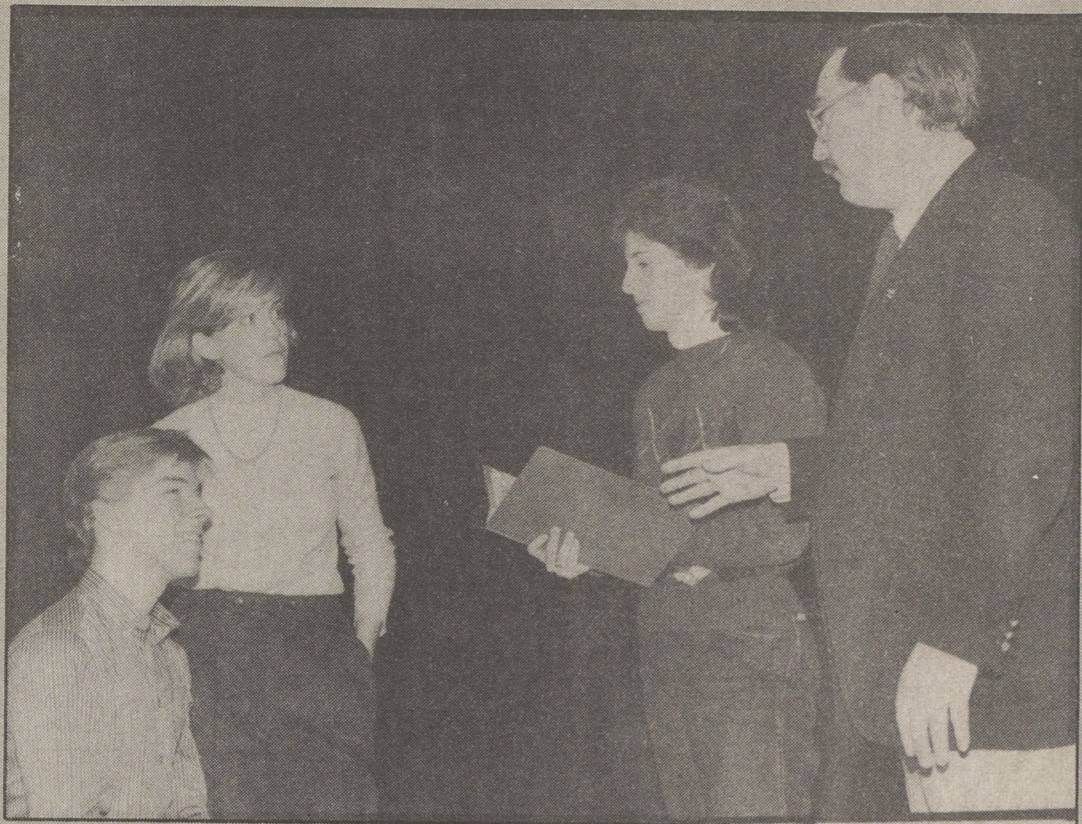

Betsy Trczinski, R.N., series instructor, will discuss hyperglycemia, drug therapy and urine and glucose testing. Hyperglycemia, a form of diabetes, occurs when dia-

betes is poorly controlled and the blood glucose level becomes too high. Signs and symptoms of hyperglycemia include thirst, weakness and fatigue, excessive urination and visual disturbances. Urine testing, as well as glucose testing, are techniques that are used to monitor how well diabetes is being controlled. Both urine and blood are examined for sugar levels.

Diabetes afflicts approximately 13 million Americans. The free series is provided as a community service to area residents by the education department of Nesbitt Memorial Hospital. 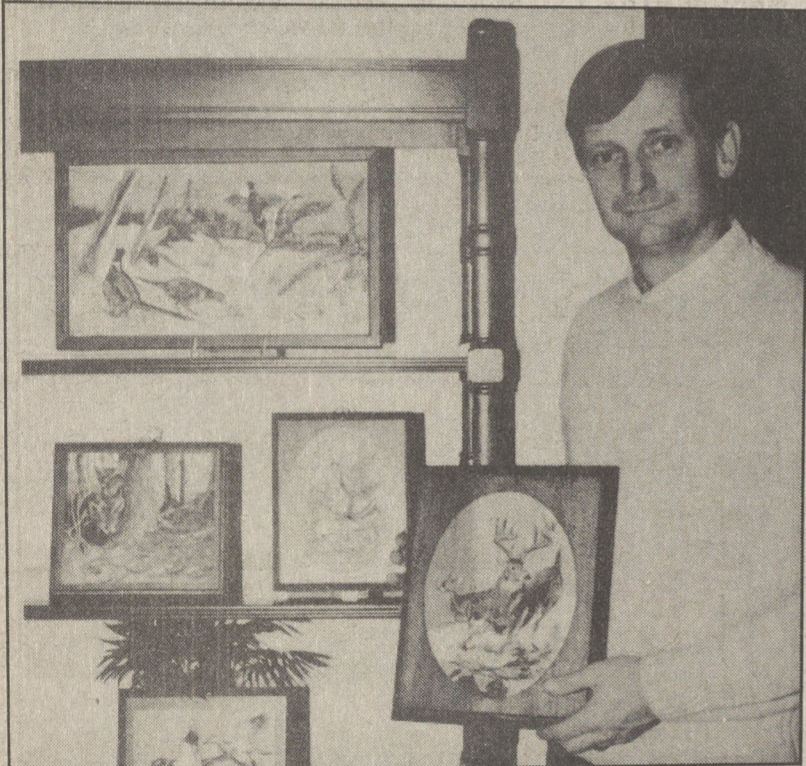
Following the breakfast, an Easter Egg Hunt sponsored by the Bowman's Creek Lions Club will be held.
