## Blind Association names officers

Eleven adults of the Greater Wyoming Valley area, who are among the 1,697 area persons screened for glaucoma detection by the Wilkes-Barre Branch, Pennsylvania Association for the Blind, during the year ending Dec. 31, 1984, were found to have symptoms of glaucoma. They and 45 other local residents, whose intra-ocular pressure registered moderate to high normal tonometer readings during the free public vision screening process offered by the city blindness prevention unit, were referred to their family physicians for followup treatment.

Mrs. Marilyn Maslow, Dallas, president of the organization reported to board members at their annual luncheon meeting held recently at the Westmoreland Club, Wilkes-Barre, noted that through the generosity and cooperation of local Lions Clubs, Wilkes-Barre Branch, PaB, is continuing to provide helpful eye safety education materials to more than 3,500 pupils in the elementary grades in the areas public and parochial schools. The materials are part of the

Sergeant Seymour eye safety project which is part of the organization's educational outreach that stresses common caution for preventing blindness.
