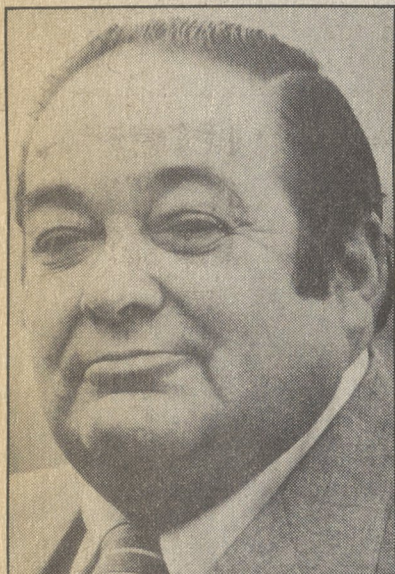




'One More Night'

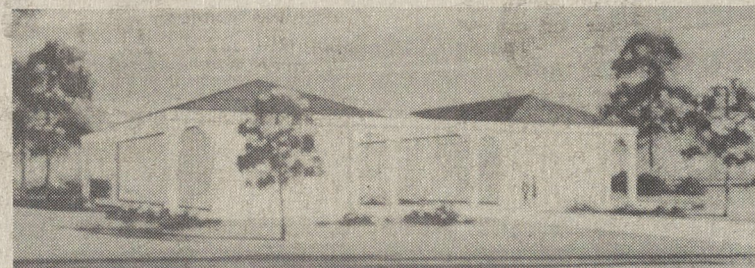
Schwartz is candidate
