Lake-Lehman is tops in Industrial Arts awards

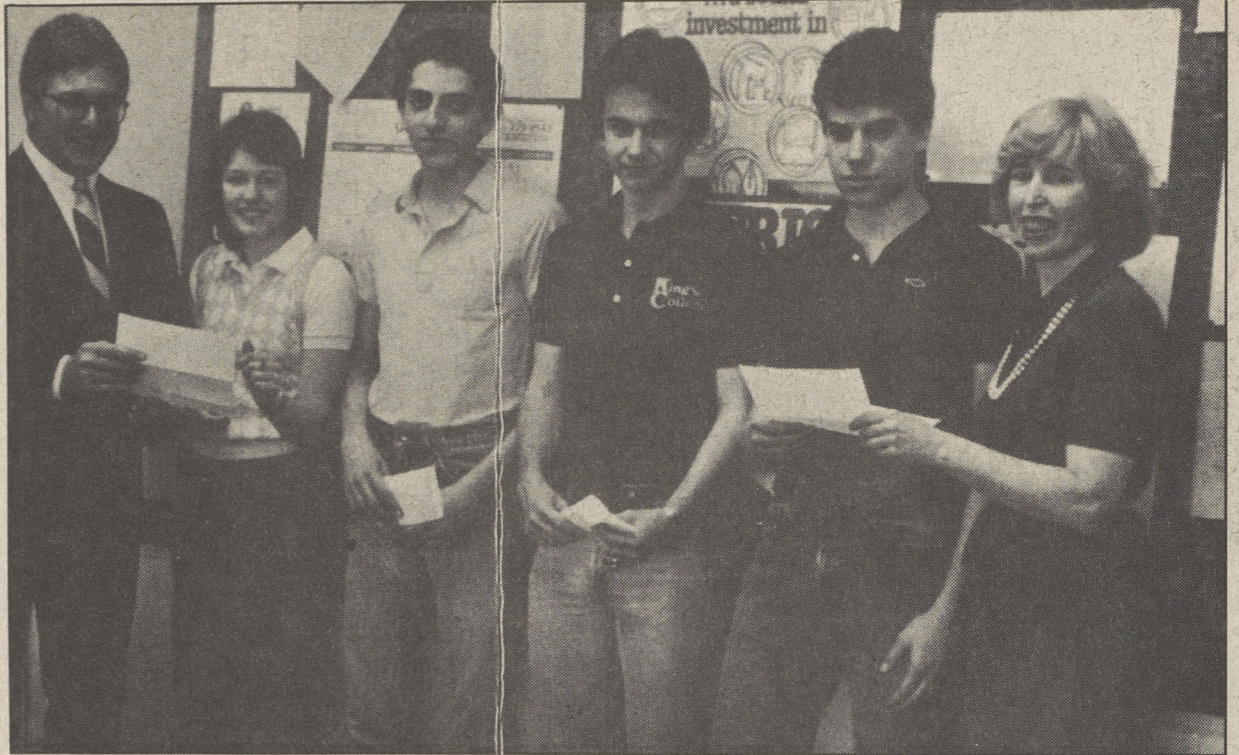
The Lake-Lehman Junior and Senior High School's branch of the Pennsylvania Industrial Arts Student Association (PA-IASA) has once again received top honors in state competition held at the Host Inn in Harrisburg on April 25, 26, and 27.

Several individuals and teams received awards and trophies at the state level competition. For the third consecutive year, Lake-Lehman High School has won the first place in the Manufacturing and Design Level II competition, and for the second consecutive year, Lake-Lehman Junior High School has won the first place in the Manufacturing and Design Level I competition. A notable accomplishment at this year's competition was made by a team comprised of Donald Buzinkai, Ronald Cross and Earl Weidner who won first place in the Industrial Bowl competition. Another significant on-site competition was won in drawing interpretation by Mark Stash (second place) and Todd Krupa (third place). Additional trophies were won by

Russell Lansberry (second place Graphic Arts Single Color Project); Donna Scull (third place Graphic Arts Single Color Project); Earl Weidner (third place Black and White Photography Project); and Russell Lansberry (third place Delta Dart Glider Design).

Two students from Lake-Lehman were elected to state office: Donald Buzinkai-Sergeant-at-Arms, an office which involves organization of regional and state competitions; and Mark Stash, parliamentary procedure decisions and assignments at all state level meetings. These two state officers will be attending an all-expense paid leadership training program at Bucknell University July 23 through 26, to assist them in developing those skills necessary to properly perform their duties as state office holders.
