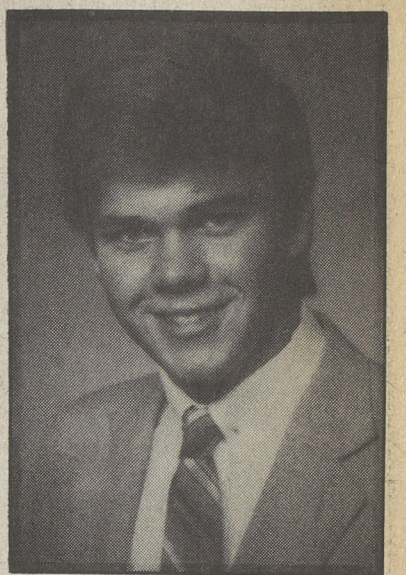
Dallas Woman's Club installs new officers

Host families being sought

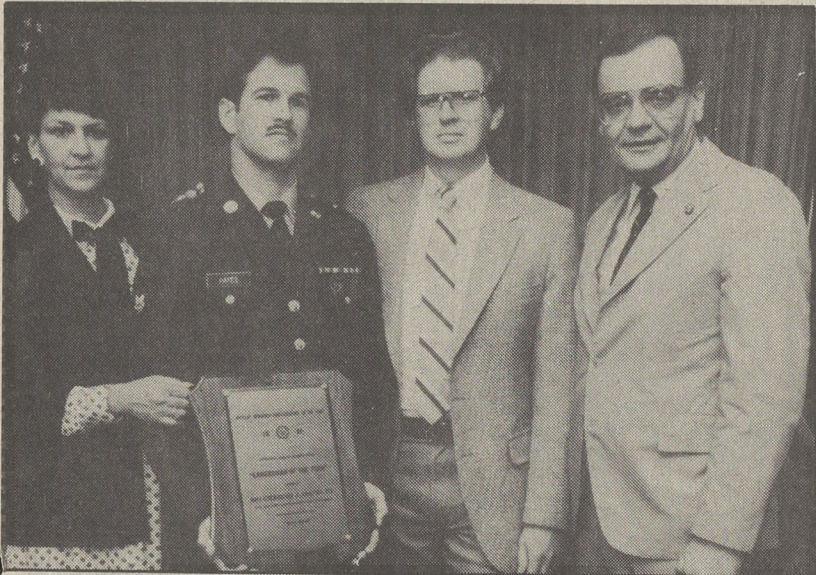
It's fresh air time again! Families from this area are needed to host a youngster from New York City.

For most children, it is probably the first true vacation they've ever had. It can be a stimulating experience to share simple adventures we take for granted, such as a hike in the woods, swimming in a pool, or just helping mow the lawn. Host families learn about a different country when the visiting youngsters bring along their habits and family histories.

The Fresh Air Fund works through various church and community agencies in New York City to arrange two week vacations for City children. If a host family expresses preference for a boy or a girl, or even a particular age, FAF tries to match the child with the host family.

The requirements for hosting a City child are simple. All that's needed is an attitude of caring and sharing — plus room for one more at the dinner table. The children will arrive from NYC on June 27 and depart on July 11.
