Cindermen split with WA, GAR

After moving to Wyoming Valley West and Bishop Hoban in a tri-meet last Wednesday, the Lake-Lehman cindermen managed a split a day earlier in the tri-meet with Wyoming Area and GAR.

In Wednesday's competition, the Knights were defeated 110-40 by the Spartans and 85-65 by Bishop Hoban. In Tuesday's competition, Wyoming took the Knights 124½-25½ while the Knights defeated GAR 85½-64½.

Taking firsts in Wednesday's action were the team of Schall, Henninger, Dennis and Janiczek 3200 Relay, 9:11.5; Dave Janiczek, 1600 Run, 4:58; Janiczek, 800 Run 2:10.2.

Placing second for the Knights were Schall, 400 Dash; Lake-Lehman team, 400 Relay; Radomski, 3200 Run; Lake-Lehman team, 1600 Relay. Third place finishers were Kazmierski, 300 Hurdles; Dennis, 800 Run; Kazmierski, high jump and Chris Van Gorder, Shot Put.

In the Tuesday competition, the Lake-Lehman 3200 Relay team of Schall, Dennis, Henninger and Janiczek took first in the 1600 Run in 4:55.4 and the 800 Run in 2:07.4.

Taking seconds were Dennis in the Pole Vault and Van Gorder in the Shot Put. Van Gorder also placed third in the Javelin.

Dallas trackmen lost to Coughlin 91-59 and to Hanover Area 80½-69½ in a tri-meet at Plains Memorial Stadium, Tuesday, May 7. The Mounts managed a sweep in a tri-meet, Monday, May 6, over Nanticoke and GAR. The Mountaineers defeated the Trojans 83-66 and took GAR 94-54.

Taking firsts in Tuesday's meet were Steve Brace, 100 Hurdles 16.3; Ron Ostrowski, 100 Dash 12.0; Brace, 300 Hurdles 42.8; Mark Liva, Shot Put 50.8; Matt Mihal, Discus 124.8 and Kern, Pole Vault 9.6.

Placing second were Ostrowski, 200 Dash; Mark Wright, 3200 Run; Liva, Discus; Wright, High Jump and Brace, Long Jump.

Coming in third were Stan Koprowski, Shot Put; and Piazis, Pole Vault.

Dallas took eight first place finishes in Monday's meet with Brace taking the 110 Hurdles in 16:3.2; Bob Oliver, 1600 Run, 4:55; Mark Liva, Shot Put 46.1; Ostrowski, 400 Run, 55.1; Brace, 300 Hurdles 43:8.2; Brace, Long Jump 18-3¼; Mark Wright, 3200 Run 10:50.5.

Second place finishers were Wright, 1600 Run; Liva, Discus; Hislop, Javelin; W. Gauthier, Long Jump; Kern, High Jump; and Hislop, Javelin.

Placing third were Eric Supey, 110 Hurdles; Koprowski, Shot Put; Wright, High Jump; Koprowski, Triple Jump; Supey, 300 Hurdles; Ostrowski, 200 Run.

The Dallas 1600 Relay team of Brace, Oliver, Farrell and Ostrowski also took a first with a time of 3:47.7.

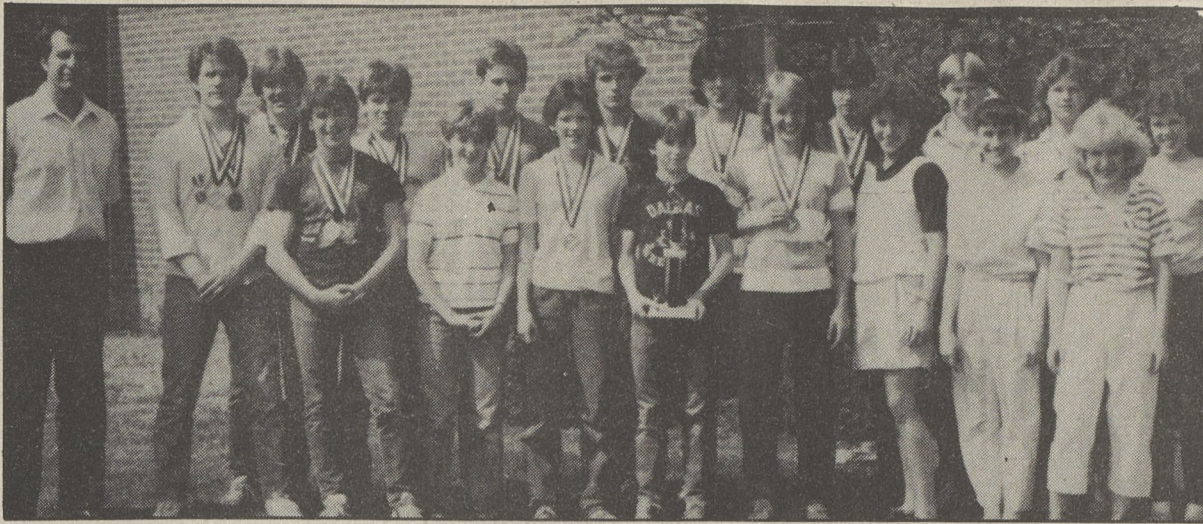
Aston, King lead Dallas

Back Mountain tracksters prepare for District 2 meet

Dallas and Lake-Lehman High School boys and girls track teams will join other member schools of District 2 this week at Wilkes-Barre Memorial Stadium to compete for an opportunity to advance to the state Track competition at Shippensburg State University.

The girls competition was set for this past Tuesday with trials beginning at 2:45 p.m. and finals starting at 6 p.m. Boys competition for the District 2 titles will be Friday with the trials starting at 2 p.m., and the finals scheduled for 6 p.m.

Both AA and AAA division team members will be in the competition with team titles to be awarded and top individuals in each event advancing to the state meet next weekend.

In the girls competition, Back Mountain athletes and the events they are apt to place near the top are 400 meter dash-Linda King, Dallas, whose top time is a mere five seconds of leader Debbie Moran, Meyers; 800 run, also Linda King who is in the top five in the district, again competing with Moran; 1600 meter run-Amy Aston, Dallas, heads the top competitors in this event and is expected to finish first although she will have Comet Amy Rusiloski right on her heels.

3200 meter run-Amy Aston, who has led in this event the entire season, with her closest competitor Jodi Iannotti of Crestwood whose time is about one minute slower; 1600 meter relay-Linda King, Laurie Ogurkis, Heather Nattress and Sue Starolis of Dallas, who have run this event among the top five teams all season; 3200 meter relay-King, Leigh Pawling, Stephanie Michael and Aston, who will live to overcome Wyoming Valley West to come in first.

In the boys competition on Friday, Dave Janiczek is Lake-Lehman's hope to come in at the top in the 800 and 1600 meter runs. Mountaineer Steve Brace will try

for first spot in the 110 and 300 meter hurdles. The Dallas 1600 meter relay team of Ron Ostrowski, Bob Oliver, Brace and Mike Farrell could take the first or second spot in that event since they have been only four seconds by top seeded Wyoming the entire season.

In the javelin event, Dallas pins its hopes on Dave Hislop, who will have to improve his distance by feet not inches if he hopes to make the trip to Shippensburg. Mountaineer Mark Wright is among the top five from the Wyoming Valley Conference who will vie for a chance to travel to states for the high jump event. Both Mark Liva and Matt Mihal of Dallas will be in contention with Daryl Boich of Meyers for a first place in the discus and Liva, who has led all others the entire season in the shot put is expected to take that event.

With District 2 teams from the Lackawanna County area also in the competition, there could be some surprises in both the girls and boys events with Lakeland, Honesdale, Scranton Prep, Scranton Central, Scranton Tech, Carbondale, entering some returning champs or top finishers from last season, in the girls events.

In the boys competition, there could be surprises from Scranton Tech's Rico Williams, Dunmore's Bill Ruddy and Lakeland's Greg Hine, Valley View's Doug Proschutti in the short sprints.

Scranton Prep's Greg Posley and Lakeland's Dave Altamiller will cause excitement for Janiczek in the 800 and Lakeland and Dunmore have tough competitors in the 1600 meter run. Janiczek will have to outdistance them and should if he is in top form. Tom Kukosky of Lake-Lehman might surprise in the 110 hurdles and Lake-Lehman's 3200 meter relay team could pull an upset over Meyers or Scranton Prep. The Knights Chris Van Gorder can come through with a long throw in the javelin if he is in condition.
