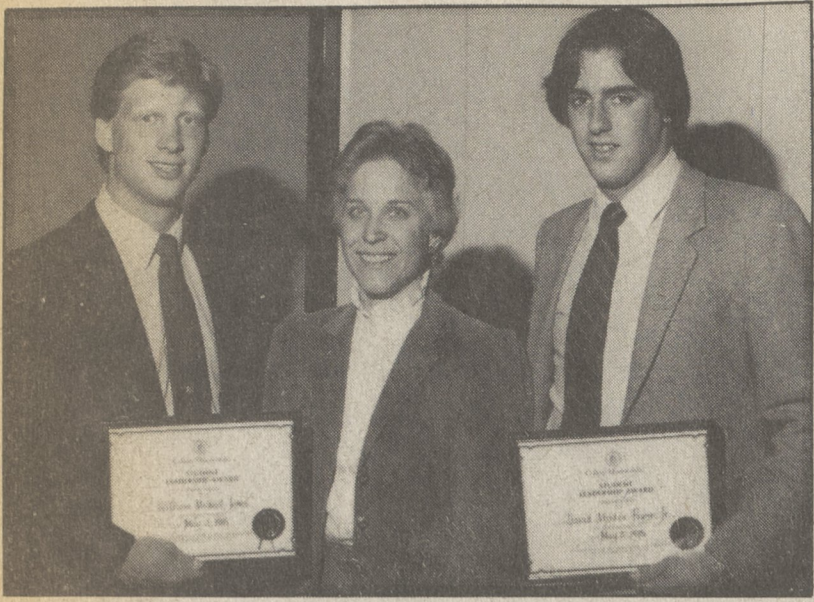

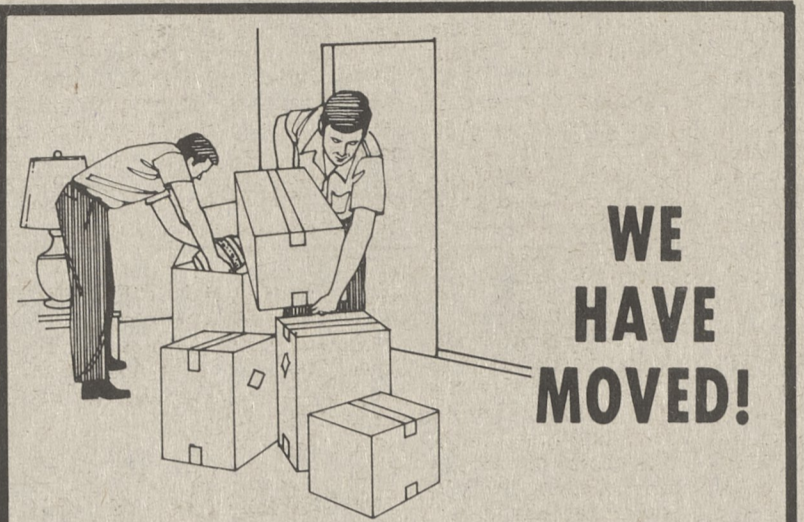
Workshop scheduled

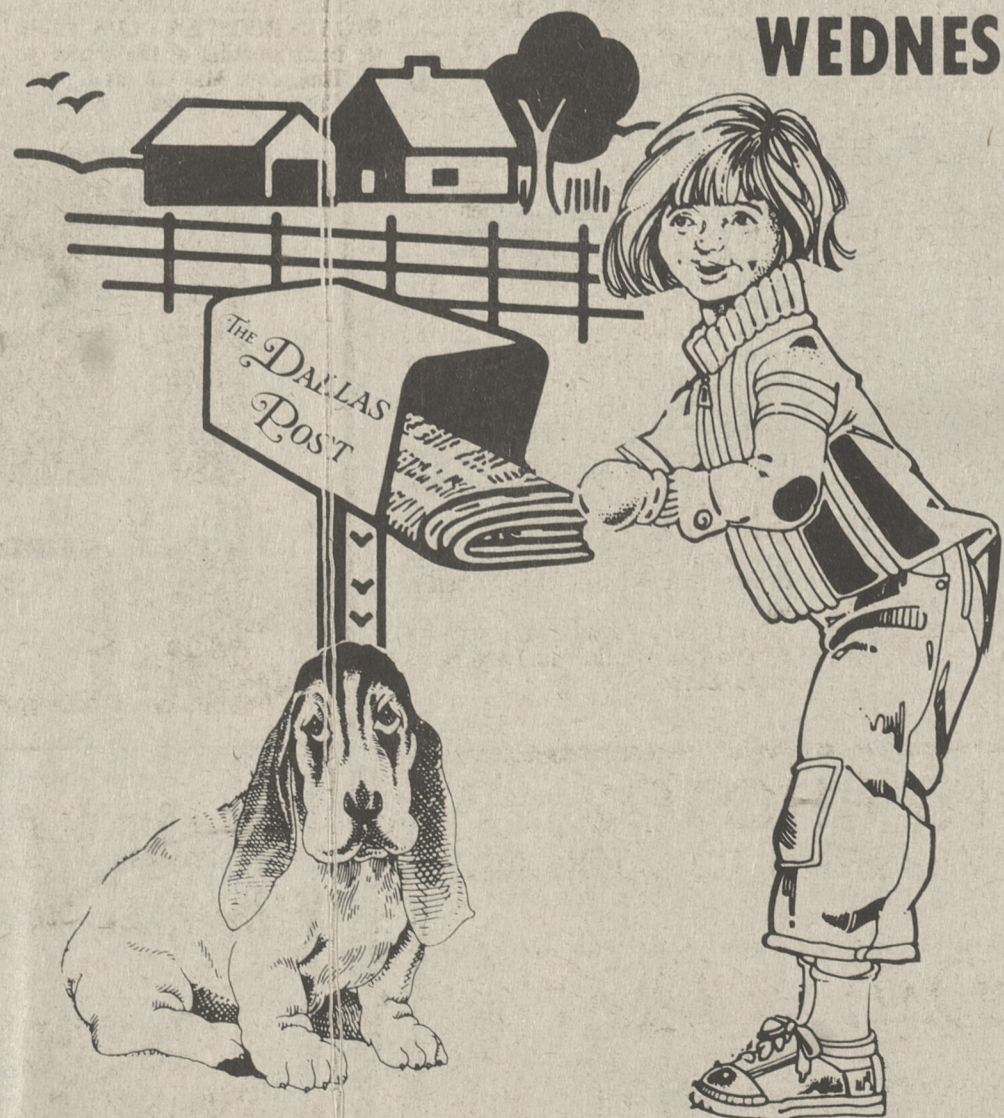
