



were affected by a recent court decision will receive a second notification from the Social Security Administration explaining that decision within the next few days.

Under the court decision (Frank Kuehner, et al. v. Heckler), persons whose disability benefits were stopped under the Social Security or Supplemental Security Income programs on or after June 1, 1976, because they were found to be no longer disabled, may request a new review of their claims as well as benefit reinstatement.

A second notice is being sent by certified mail to all affected class members because a few hundred of those previously notified received incorrect notices because of a printing error. Those notices contained information not related to the Pennsylvania ruling.

Everyone receiving the new notice will have 120 days from the date of the second notice to request a new review of their claim and reinstatement of benefits. Affected class members who have already contacted a Social Security office after getting the first notice and requested a new review will not
