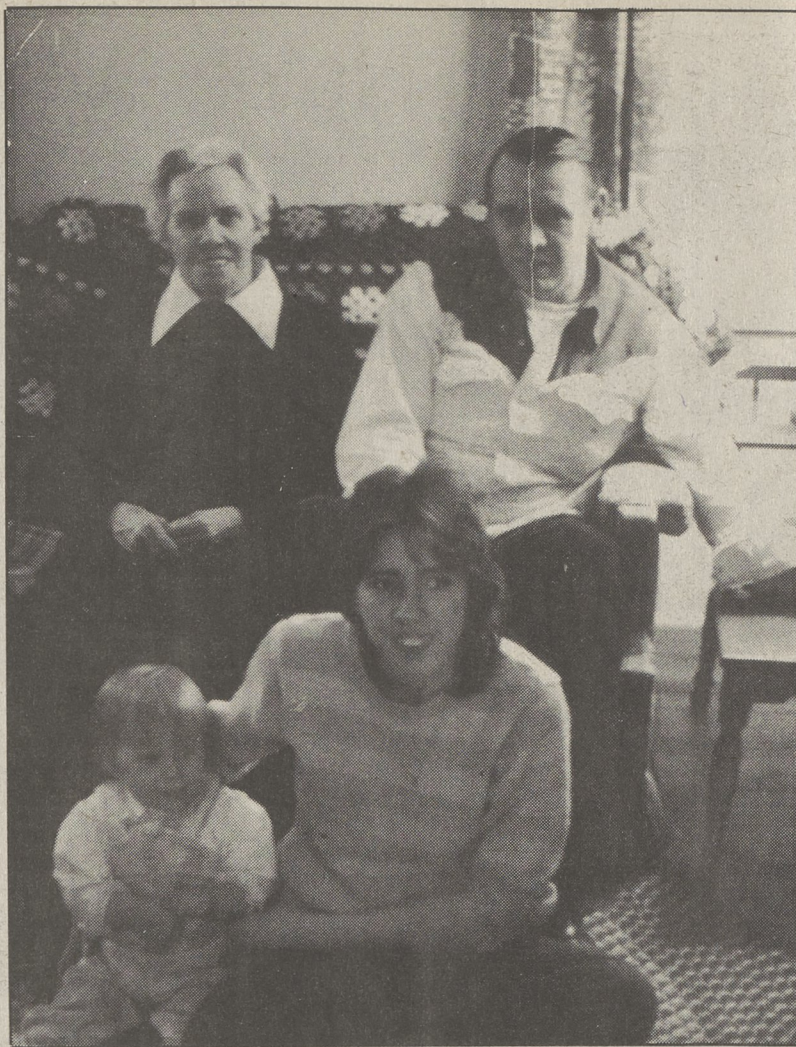
Richie is contest winner

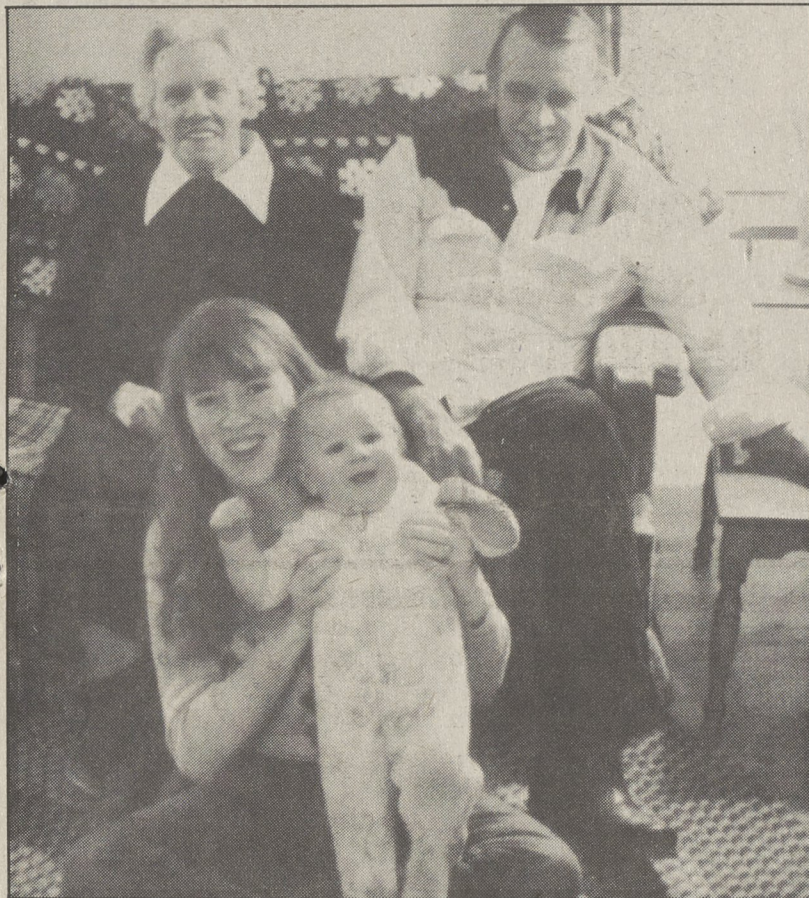
Linda is editor-in-chief of her school newspaper, "The Mountaineer" and plans to attend King's College in the fall, majoring in communications.
