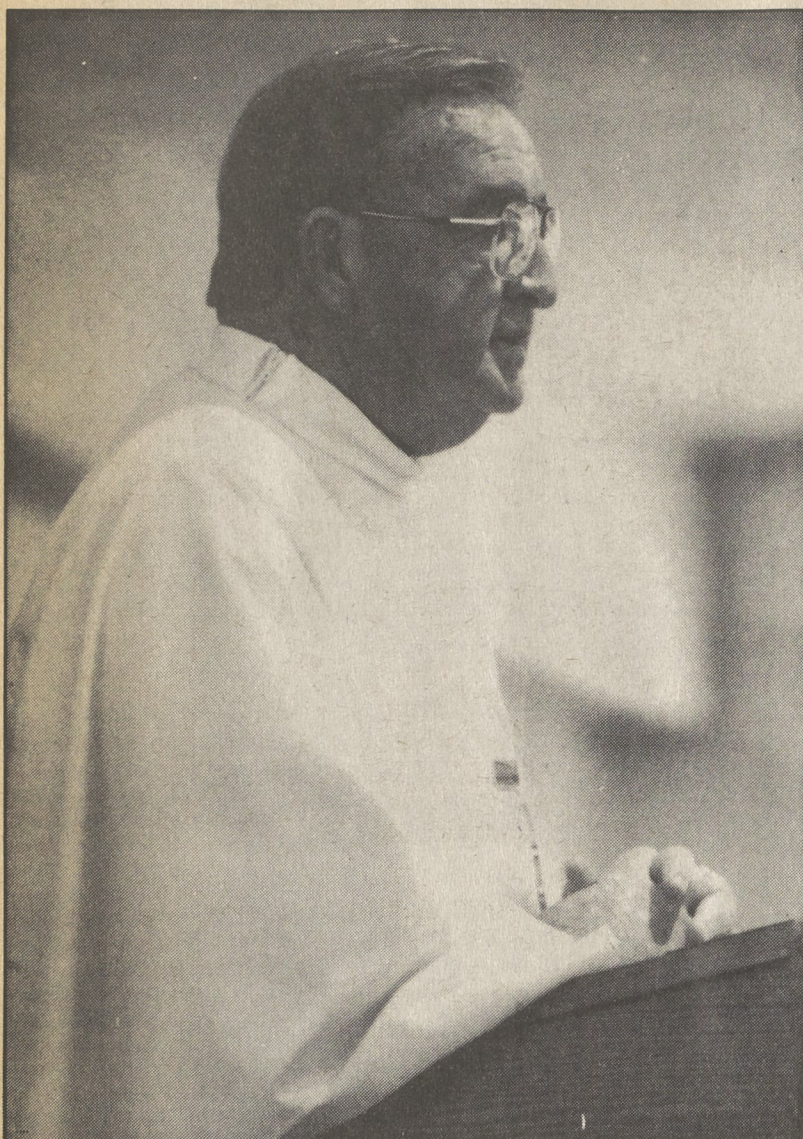

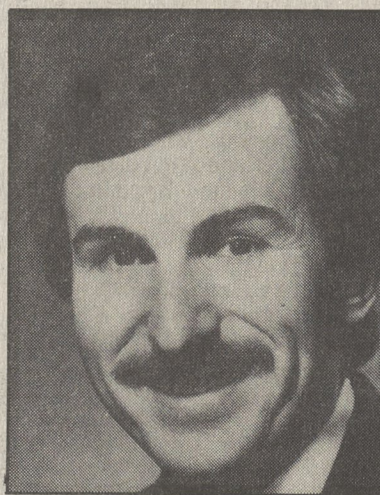
## Peslak appointed manager

## Certificates awarded

Gertrude T. Dragon, techno-therapist and Lorrie M. Duris, dental assistant, at the Monroe-Noxen Health Center, Route 29, Noxen have been awarded professional certifications by the Dental Assisting National Board, Inc.

They have achieved status as Certified Dental Assistants by passing a rigorous written examination. Since the Certified Dental Assistant program was established in 1948, approximately 100,000 dental assistants have been certified. The Dental Assisting National Board designs and administers the test which gauges the working knowledge of candidates.

In addition to passing the test, Ms. Dragon and Ms. Duris had to meet certain eligibility requirements of education and experience. The Board bases certification not only on general chairside competence but, also, on mastery of management skills and on the techniques of surgical assisting.

The two Monroe-Noxen staff members have demonstrated command of a number of subjects such as hygiene, sanitation, radiation health and safety, and laboratory procedures. Certification also indicates their attainment of a variety of techniques to assist the office's dentists in providing patient care.

Ms. Dragon attended Lake Noxen School and LaSalle Institute. Ms. Duris is a graduate of Dallas Senior High School and Luzerne County Community College.
