





Certificates awarded

The Dental Assisting National Board designs and administers the test which gauges the working knowledge of candidates.


In addition to passing the test, Ms. Dragon and Ms. Duris had to meet certain eligibility requirements of education and experience. The Board bases certification not only on general chairside competence but, also, on mastery of management skills and on the tech-

niques of surgical assisting.
The two Monroe-Noxen staff members have demonstrated command of a number of subjects such as hygiene, sanitation, radiation health and safety, and laboratory procedures. Certification also indicates their attainment of a variety of techniques to assist the office's
