



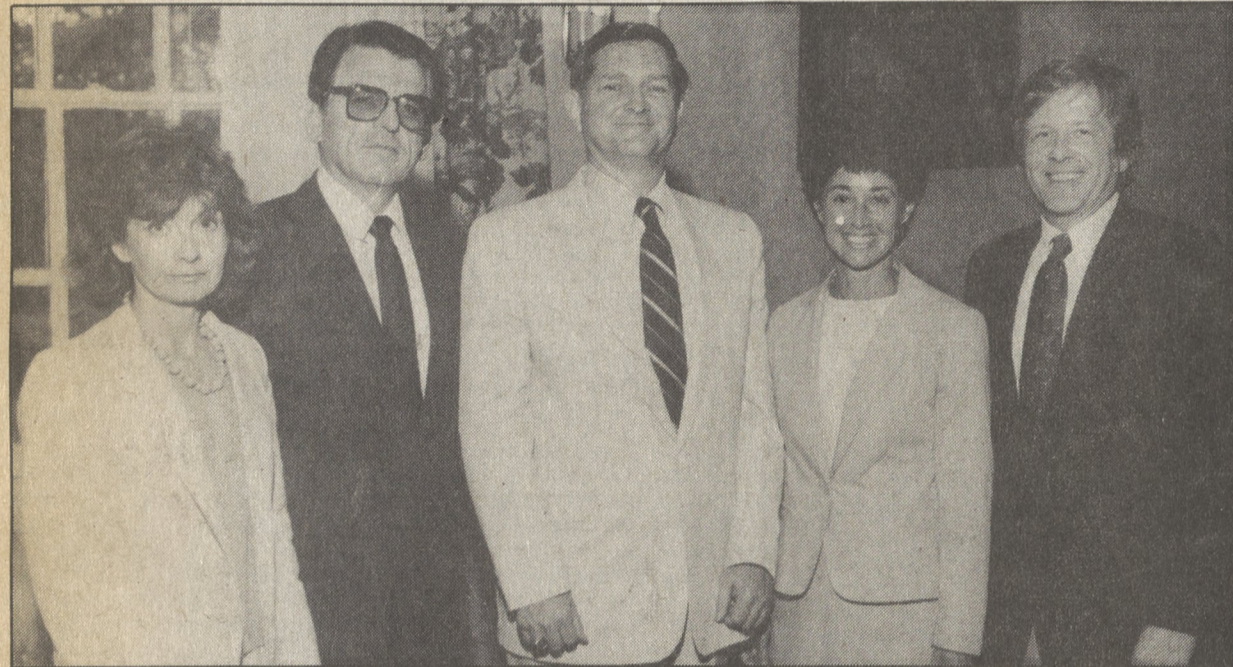
Members inducted

Students participate in program

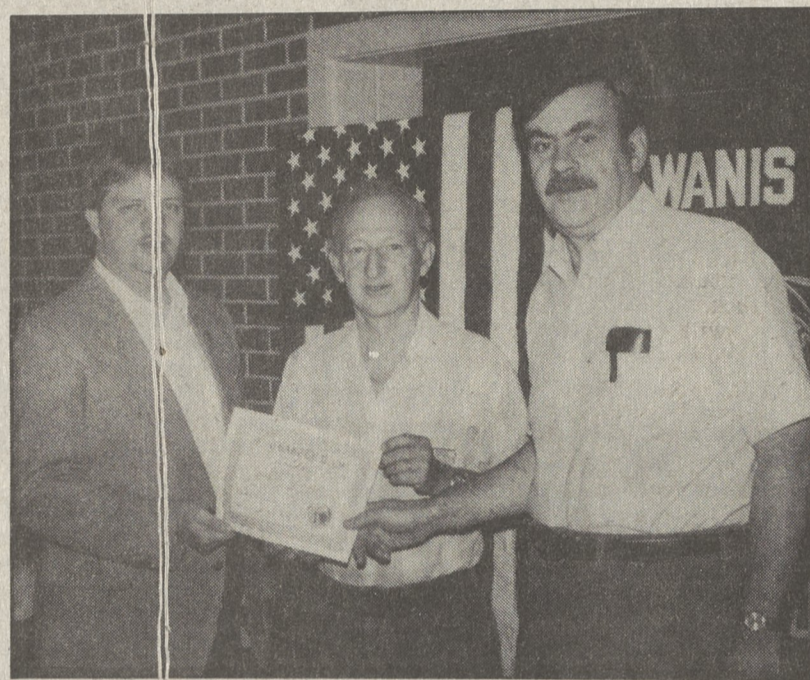

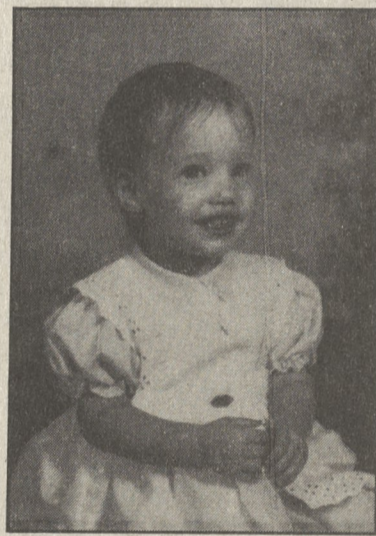
Kiwanis meets
