Sen. Heinz introduces legislation

Senator John Heinz (R-PA) recently introduced legislation to protect widows and widowers from the Social Security's Administra-tion's "Big Brother" debt collection tactics.

"Almost a quarter of a million Americans annually suffer the shock of a bank statement with a large debit to the Social Security Administration; a withdrawal made without the account holder's permission, made to correct a government error," Heinz said. "Too often the victim of these bureaucratic outrages is the recent victim of personal loss; the surviving spouse of a deceased Social Security benefi-

Heinz, who chairs the Special Committee on Aging, made his comments at a press conference where he heard the story of Berdie Thomas, a 65-year-old widow from East Palo Alto, California. Thomas, whose only income is the several hundred dollars she receives in monthly benefits, reported her husband's death in 1980 to the Social Security Administration and closed their joint bank account. But SSA continued to deposit her husband's benefits for five months anyway, Thomas told Heinz.

Heinz told reporters that he first learned of these clandestine forages into people's bank accounts at a hearing of the Committee in 1983. "Although we've had some luck in getting the Treasury Department to at least require that banks notify living beneficiaries of any direct debit action, we ran into a brick wall at SSA when trying to get survivors the same rights.
