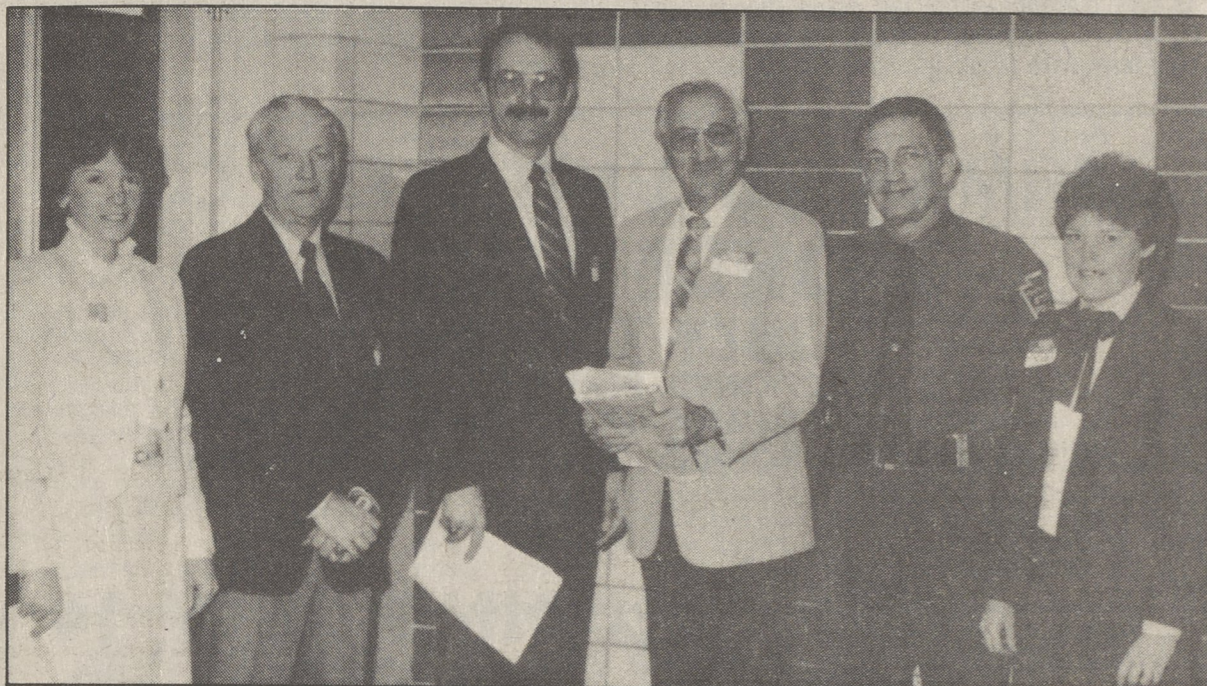
Discussion held
