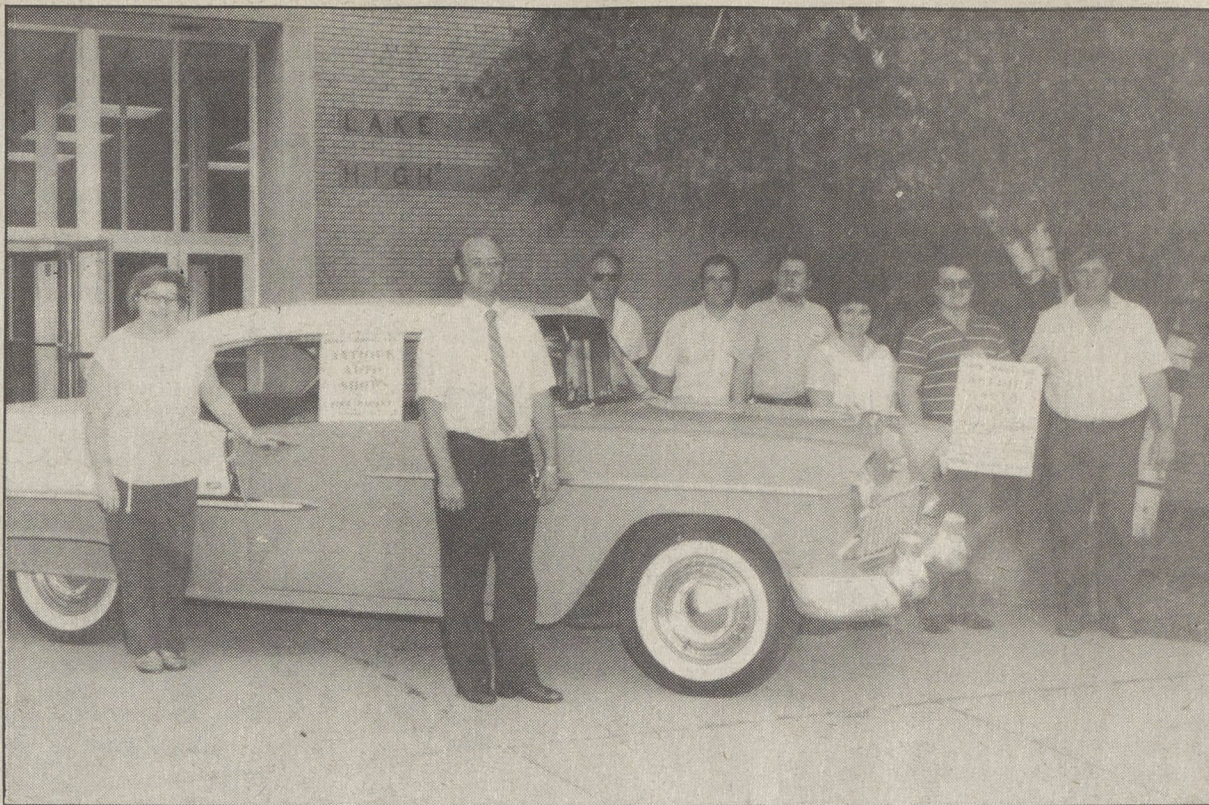

## Polka Party slated

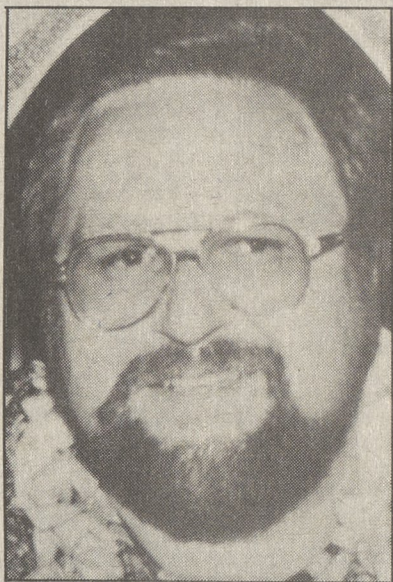
