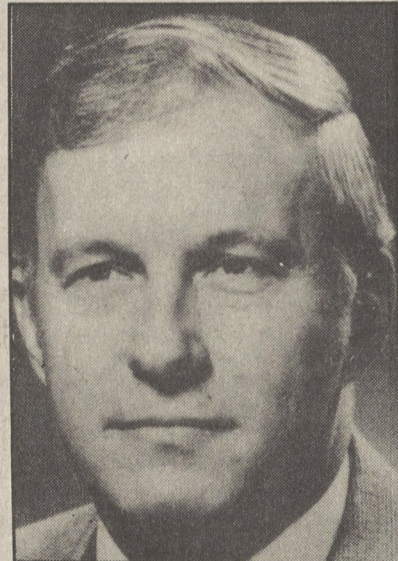
disputes over child custody and visitation.
