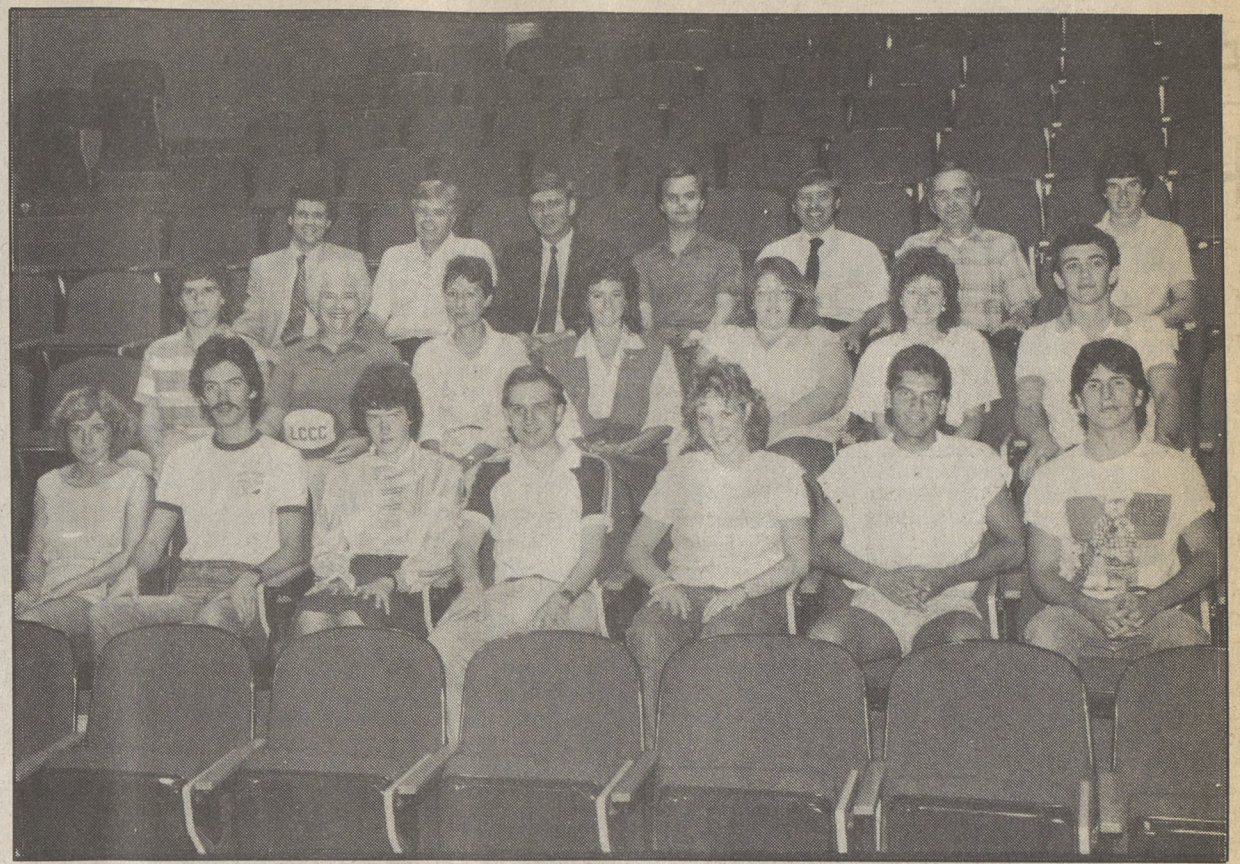

Orientation held

Orientation activities on the Penn State Wilkes-Barre campus will begin with four special sessions scheduled Sunday, Aug. 18 through Wednesday, Aug. 21 to introduce freshmen to a new campus involvement concept. Each of the 350 incoming freshmen has been designated a member of one of four "Prides", social organizations intended to provide all students with an immediate sense of belonging. On Thursday, Aug. 22, a traditional Orientation Day will offer an introduction to special interest groups, such as those for veterans and returning adults, as well as to the work study and athletic programs. Afterward, freshmen will have the opportunity to meet individually with their advisors and will attend an academic convocation.
