Orientation activities on the Penn State Wilkes-Barre campus will begin with four special sessions scheduled Sunday, Aug. 18 through Wednesday, Aug. 21 to introduce freshmen to a new campus involvement concept. Each of the 350 incoming freshmen has been designated a member of one of four "Prides", social organizations intended to provide all students with an immediate sense of belonging.
