Classes to begin

Wilkes-Barre General Hospital will hold a seven-week series of Childbirth Preparation Classes beginning Monday, Aug. 19. The classes, held Mondays from 7 to 9 p.m. are taught by registered nurses from General's Obstetrics Department and are free-of-charge. Classes are designed to answer the many questions that arise during pregnancy and to better prepare parents for labor and delivery. Topics range from prenatal care to infant nutrition and include relaxation and breathing techniques, body conditioning exercises and types of deliveries. Classes should be attended in conjunction with regular visits to a physician and are open to all area couples and single parents regardless of the hospital in which they plan to deliver. For those parents-to-be who have one or more child, a refresher course will be offered on Monday, Sept. 30. This one-night class reviews the stages of labor and the various relaxation and breathing techniques. Eisenpreis to speak

To honor Family Service Association of Wyoming Valley at its 90th Annual Meeting, which highlights the "Year of the Family" in Wyoming Valley, a distinguished former resident will return to be the principal speaker. The Luncheon Meeting will be held on Thursday, Noon, September 5, at the Sheraton-Crossgates Hotel, Wilkes-Barre.

Alfred Eisenpreis - with an outstanding background in retailing, government and newspapers - is a futurist, whose topic will forecast the future state of the family. In this age of changing lifestyles and values, Mr. Eisenpreis will analyze past, current and future social trends, and their effects on family life.

Born in Germany, Eisenpreis came to Wyoming Valley at an early age, and received his education here, graduating from Wilkes College. His first retailing experience was with Pomeroy's, Wilkes-Barre. From 1943-1973, he was a Senior Management Executive of Allied Stores Corp., one of the largest U.S. department store companies.

In 1974, Eisenpreis was appointed Commissioner-Administrator for Economic Development for the City of New York. He was also responsible for the Port of New York, and directed the famous "Operation Sail" program, New York's Bi-centennial Salute.

He has served as consultant to the Executive Office of the President of the U.S. on Economic Stabilization under Presidents Johnson, Nixon and Ford.

Following his government service, Eisenpreis joined the Newspaper Advertising Bureau of Vice Presi-

dent for Retail Marketing. In this post, which he currently holds, he is responsible for the coordination of newspapers' services to the retail industry. Mr. Eisenpreis also administers the regional programs in the Bureau's Los Angeles, Chicago and Atlanta offices.
