Elementary school homerooms listed

Dallas students will begin school on Sept. 4. The Dallas Schools staff will participate in In-Service Orientation Programs prior to the opening of school.

Parents are reminded that on opening day all elementary students in grades one through six will attend full-day sessions. Daily schedules for elementary students in grades one to four will be from 9:15 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. and for Intermediate School students in grades four, five, and six, from 9:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Parents should consult the bus routes published in the newspapers to determine their child's bus assignment and departure points. It is requested that all students in grades one to six ride to and from school the first day so that they become familiar with their bus assignment and to aid the district in maintaining accurate and comprehensive student bus riding records.

If it is necessary for a parent to accompany a child to school, it is suggested that the student ride the bus and the parent meet the student at the school building.

The schedule of school entry for kindergarten students is being provided to parents during the Student-Parent-Teacher Pre-School Conferences.

At the Intermediate School, all fourth and fifth grade students will report to the cafeteria and sixth grade students will report to their assigned homerooms.

All elementary students can bring their own lunch to school or purchase a hot lunch for 85 cents or milk for 25 cents.

Parent information meetings are being planned and will be announced shortly.

School starts in one week

The 1985-86 school year will begin for all students in the Dallas School district on Sept. 4. The district's professional staff will participate in an in-service program beginning Sept. 3.

Daily schedules for all elementary students in grades 1-4 will be from 9:15 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.; the Dallas Intermediate School students, grades 4, 5 and 6, will attend from 9:15 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Junior High School students in grades 7-9 begin school at 8 a.m. and dismiss at 2:49 p.m. The high school begins at 8 a.m. and dismisses at 2:58 p.m.

Upon arrival at school, all elementary students assigned to the Westmoreland and Dallas township Elementary Schools are requested to move to their assigned areas and classrooms. Class lists and special directions will be posted in each elementary building and staff will be available to assist pupils in locating their rooms.

At the Dallas Intermediate School, fourth and fifth grade students are asked to report to the school

cafeteria; sixth grade students should report directly to their assigned classrooms. The schedule of school entry for kindergarten students is being provided to parents during the student-parent-teacher pre-school conferences.

Dallas Junior High School students are asked to meet at the following locations: 7th grade in the auditorium, 8th grade in the cafeteria, and 9th grade in the gymnasium.

Dallas Senior High School sophomores are requested to report to the high school auditorium. All juniors and seniors should consult the bulletin board listings in the cafeteria and report to their assigned homerooms.

Secondary students who have not registered for school should report to the building office of their respective schools. All elementary pupils not registered should report to Mrs. Susan Farr at the Dallas School District Administration Offices, Church Street, Dallas.

The school lunch program will begin on the first day of school. Student lunches cost 85¢ for elementary pupils and 95¢ for secondary students.

Junior high ready for students

Preparations for the opening of the Dallas Junior High School are underway.

Leon A. Trager, junior high assistant principal, and his staff have been busy all summer readying the building and program for opening classes on Sept. 4.

The school's master schedule has been constructed to provide each student with a well-rounded program of studies supplemented with numerous co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities.

Seventh, eighth, and ninth grade students will report to the junior high school building between 7:45 and 8 a.m. Seventh-grade students will report directly to the auditorium. Eighth-grade students will

report directly to the cafeteria while ninth graders meet in the gymnasium.

A short orientation program including assignment to homerooms

will be given. Students will then report to their homerooms in preparation for their first day of school.

Students will be able to purchase lunch on the first day of school.
