Kingston Township police reported that a side door and window of the Westmoreland Elementary School, were vandalized last Thursday night.

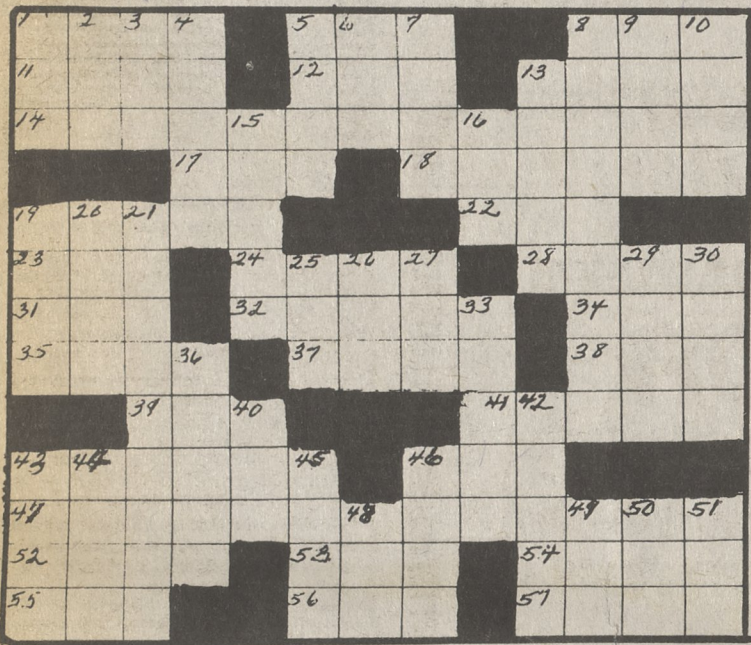
Police have no clues. Kingston Township police Chief Paul Sabol said the damage was approximately \$100.

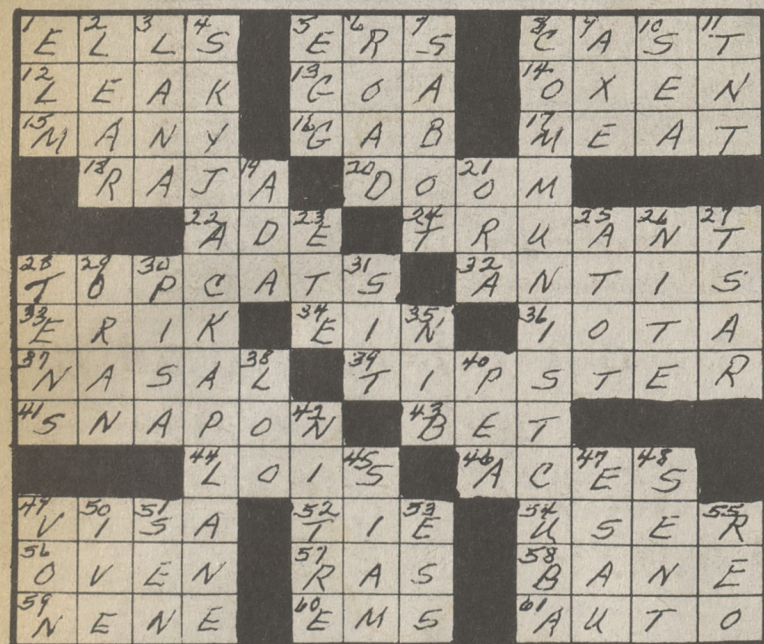
