Master Chief Personnelman Lawrence E. Stallard, USN, son of Ralph and Anna Schultz of Salamanca, has reported for duty at the Naval Military Personnel Command (NMPC) in Washington, D.C.

As Head of the Classification Section of the Navy Enlisted Occupational Class System Division, Master Chief Stallard approves all Navy enlisted occupational categories including both new positions and modifications of existing ones.

Overseas duty included two years in Guam, three years in Rota, Spain, and his last duty before reporting to Washington-Stuttgart, Germany, where he was personnel officer for the Personnel Support Activity Detachment from June 1983 until July 1985.

Stallard's naval career was not limited to shroe duty. He served aboard the carrier USS Franklin D. Roosevelt (CV-42), operating out of Mayport, Fla.; the guided missile cruiser USS Sterrett (CG-31), operating out of San Diego, Calif.; and the guided missile destroyer USS Lynde McCormick (DDG-8) also out of San Diego.
