She will succeed student-coach Toby Eichas, a May graduate, who had an 8-10 record last season.

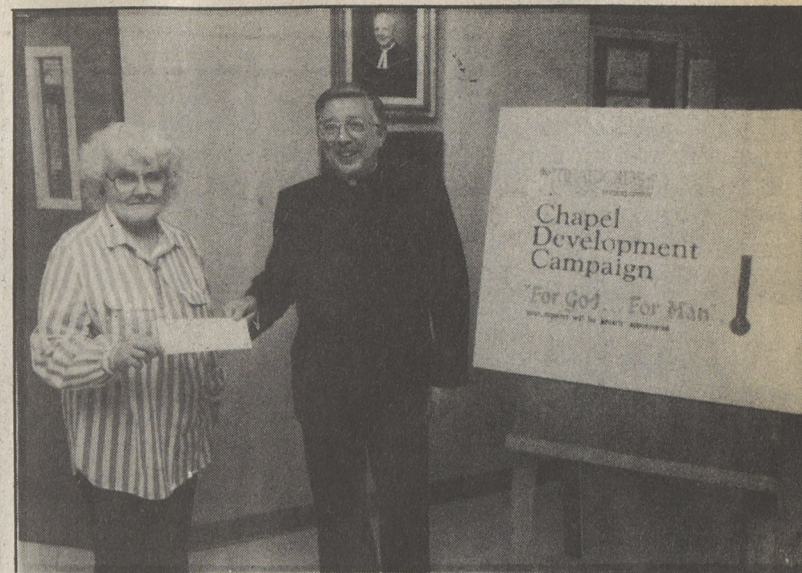
Kozich is a graduate of Dallas High School, and received her BA degree from College Misericordia with a minor in psychology. She played basketball and field hockey in high school and college.
