## Lehman runners sweep meet

Lake-Lehman cross country runners took five of the top six places in their tri-meet with Crestwood and Meyers to make it a clean sweep. Coach Narkiewicz' long distance runners took the Comets 15-47 and the Mohawks by a 17-49 score.

The Knights took the first three spots with Dana Henninger coming in front with 17:21, followed by Dave Radomski with 17:36 and Robert Castellani with 17:59.

Meyers' Robert McFadden came in fourth with 18:07, followed by Black Knight Bryan Powell in 18:15. Knight Joe Smith finished sixth in 18:18 and Crestwood's Matt Mathias was seventh with 18:20.

The Mohawks took eighth, ninth and 10th spots but Weaver finished 11th for the Knights and Judge came in 14th. Sloat took 12th for Meyers and Aigeldinger and Testa finished 13th and 15th respectively for the Comets.

On Tuesday, the Knights defeated Seton Catholic 15-45 with Henninger leading the pack with a time of 16:51. Knights Radomski placed second in 16:59, Brian Powell, third, in 17:14, Bob Castellani, fourth in 17:23, and Joe Smith, fifth in 17:42.
